**Please state the ground(s) for review** (please read guidance note 1) These premises have historically come to Police attention as a result of complaints from local residents. The complaints relate in the main to noise nuisance from entertainment, noise from customers and the premises operating after it authorised hours. The complaints have been investigated and warnings given where appropriate. However the premises has seen a number of changes of management and so the policy of issuing warnings in the first instance has meant that any enforcement process has had to be restarted when a new manger is appointed. This has effectively meant that no real action has been taken against the premises which has resulted in the local community suffering over a number of years.

In July 2013, after the departure of yet another manager who was responsible for a number of complaints relating to the premises, a meeting was held with the new manager and the representative for the Premises Licence Holder. At the meeting the police outlined that the situation could not continue and any further complaints relating to the premises would result in review proceedings being instigated.

The new manager operated the premises between July and December 2013 with no issues being reported, however she left and the premises was closed over Christmas and New Year.

In March 2014 new managers were placed into the premises and on 8<sup>th</sup> March a complaint was received by the police from a resident who was subjected to excessivley loud music.

The Police are no longer prepared to carry on with issuing warnings as they have not previously provided a sustainable resolution to the problems. Therefore they have no option but to bring this to the attention of the Licensing Committee with a view to seeking a more long term sustainable solution.

#### Premises History

- 1. These premises are situated in the quiet rural area of Aughton and in close proximity to residential properties.
- 2. They have the benefit of a premises licence as a result of an application by the Premises Licence Holder to convert the licence during the transitional period of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 3. The application specified the Designated Premises Supervisor as being Yvette Lightfoot.
- It should be noted that prior to the conversion the premises operated under a Justices licence which authorised the sale of alcohol within the standard hours of operation permitted under the 1964 Act, these being;

Mon – Sat 11:00 to 23:00 Sun 12:00 to 22:30

- It should be further noted that the premises at this time did not have the benefit of a Public Entertainment Licence and was therefore unable to provide music and associated activities.
- 6. The premises is also subject to a number of planning conditions as a result of a planning application made in September 1999, one of which stipulates that no part of the land to the rear of the property shall be used for outside drinking.
  - 7. This was no doubt imposed to provide some protection for local residents whose properties adjoin the premises.
  - 8. In conjunction with the conversion application there was also an application made to vary the premises licence to increase the hours relating to the sale by

retail of alcohol and to include the provision of regulated entertainment in the

9. The variation requested the following increase in hours for all licensable activity as follows;

Mon - Thur11:00 to 00:00Fri & Sat11:00 to 01:00Sun11:00 to 23:30

- 10. The variation application also specified the opening hours of the premises to be an additional 30 minutes after the cessation of licensable activity and requested an additional hour to be added to the provision of licensable activities as non standard timings for various days of importance throughout the year.
- 11. The police did not make representations against the granting of the variation however did make representations regarding the non-standard timings believing that the extra hour of operation would have an impact on the community.
- 12. The Council Environmental Health Department also made representations regarding the premises opening after 23:00, providing regulated entertainment and the potential impact of the noise on the local community.
- 13. The police representations were resolved through negotiations with the applicants who agreed to withdraw the non-standard timings.
- 14. The EHO representations were resolved by way of agreed conditions being imposed on the licence to ensure the local residents had some protection from potential noise breakout from the premises.
- 15. After the representations were withdrawn the premises licence was issued and became live from 25<sup>th</sup> November 2005.
- 16. The police will say that a historic check of their incident logging system from .25<sup>th</sup> November 2005 back to January 2000 revealed only 8 incidents connected to the premises
- 17. Of these 8 incidents 3 relate to reports of burglary at the premises, 2 reports of drink drivers at the premises, a concern for welfare for Yvette Lightfoot, a report of music disturbing local residents, which when investigated was a found not to be attributable to the premises and a report of after-hours drinking which was not resolved as there was no available patrols to deploy.

18. In essence then there was in 5, years only 1 genuine report from a local ---resident relating to being disturbed by the premises which was never resolved.

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- 19. In January 2006 a new premises licence was applied for, believed as a result of structural alterations, this was granted with the same hours of operation and conditions as already held and is the current licence in operation. (Copy attached at Appendix 1).
- 20. In March 2006 an application was made to specify a change in DPS to JJ Whitehouse.
- 21. Mr Whitehouse remained at the premises for approximately 7 months during which the police received 1 complaint about loud music from the premises. (Details attached in document at Appendix 2).
- 22. In October 2006 an application was made to specify a change in DPS to Joanne Beamer.
- 23. Joanne remained at the premises for approximately 3 months during which the police received 1 complaint regarding noise from the premises. (Details attached in document at Appendix 2).
- 24. In January 2007 an application was made to specify a change in DPS to Patricia Nabli.
- 25. Patricia remained at the premises for approximately 18 months during which time the police received 8 complaints regarding loud noise and music from the premises. (Details attached in document at Appendix 2).
- 26. On 21<sup>st</sup> July 2008 the Local Authority received information that the premises was under new management, a visit to the premises revealed that Patricia Nabli had left the premises 2 weeks earlier with no notification from either her or Punch Taverns.
- 27. Further enquiries revealed that the premises was being managed by a Tina at the Royal Oak, she was contacted and advised of the requirement for Punch to make an application to transfer the DPS.
- 28. On 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2008 as no application was received a call was made to Punch Taverns, this resulted in an application being made the following day to transfer the DPS to Clare Andrews.

- 29. Clare remained at the premises for approximately 5 months during which time the police received 2 complaints relating to noise and loud music from the \_\_\_\_\_ premises. (Details attached in document at Appendix 2).
- 30. In December 2008 an application was made to specify a change in DPS to Colin McTaggart.
- 31. Colin remained at the premises for approximately 20 months during which time the police received 2 complaints relating to noise and after hours drinking. (Details attached in document at Appendix 2).
- 32. In August 2010 an application was made to specify a change in DPS to Andrew Forber.
- 33. Andrew remained at the premises for 3 weeks during which time no complaints were received.
- 34. In August 2010 an application was made to specify a change in DPS to Margaret Murphy.
- 35. Margaret remained at the premises, on paper, for 8 months, however in real terms she was only there for approximately 7 months as is outlined below.
- 36. During the time Margaret was at the premises the police received 2 complaints of noise and rowdy behaviour at the premises. (Details attached in document at Appendix 2).
- 37. On 6<sup>th</sup> April 2011 the licensing officer from West Lancashire Borough Council visited the premises and spoke to an Emma Sharkey, who stated she was taking on the lease and that Margaret Murphy would remain as DPS until Emma had completed her course which she was due to take the following week.
- 38. Emma confirmed she was running the premises and that Margaret Murphy only worked there 3 nights a week
- 39. On 8<sup>th</sup> April 2011 a further visit was conducted at the premises by the licensing officer who provided Emma Sharkey with a copy of the premises licence and attached conditions.
- 40. It was noted that the premises was at this time advertising Champagne Breakfasts, however this was outside their operating times and they were advised that they needed to cancel it if they intended to sell alcohol before 11am as no TEN application had been made.

- 41 On 19<sup>th</sup> April 2011 the local authority received information that suggested Margaret Murphy was no longer at the premises, as such a call was made to the premises and a message left for Emma Sharkey to re-contact the council.
  - 42. Emma did not return the call so the licensing officer visited the premises, however she was not available at this time.
  - 43. In an attempt to establish the current situation with regards Margaret Murphy, being DPS, the licensing officer contacted the area manager for the premises Mark Wrigley.
  - 44. Mark Wrigley stated that Margaret Murphy was still DPS at the premises and that Emma would take over when she had completed her course, it was however pointed out that it had been two weeks since Emma stated she was doing the course.
  - 45. Mark Wrigley went on to state that Margaret Murphy was still at the premises and in fact worked there 30 hours a week, this was in complete contrast to what Emma Sharkey had told the officer.
  - 46. The licensing officer was not happy with what they had been told and contacted the police licensing officer to raise concerns over Margaret Murphy being an absent DPS.
  - 47. On 20<sup>th</sup> April 2011 the police licensing officer contacted Margaret Murphy and sent her an E-mail asking her to confirm her current involvement with the premises.
  - 48. She replied by return of E- Mail that she was no longer involved with the premises and had in fact left three weeks ago, so what was effectively the end of March. (Copy of these E-Mails attached at Appendix 3)
  - 49. This was of concern as it effectively meant that both the statements made by Emma Sharkey at para's 37 & 38 and Mark Wrigley at para 45 were at best erroneous or at worst mendacious.
  - 50. This was brought to the attention of Mark Wrigley by leaving a message on his answerphone with a request to call back, however no call was received.
  - 51. On Friday 22nd April the police licensing officer contacted Emma Sharkey to confirm if the premises were still trading in light of the fact that there was technically no DPS at the premises.

- 52. Emma Sharkey confirmed she was trading and had been told she could \_\_\_\_\_\_ continue to do so by Mark Wrigley acting on instructions from Punch's \_\_\_\_\_\_ solicitors as Margaret had not officially withdrawn herself as DPS.
- 53. The police licensing officer outlined the view that in reality there was no DPS at the premises as she had left and that technically as she had nothing to do with the premises the sale of alcohol could be unlawful.
- 54. The licensing officer requested she convey this view to Mark Wrigley as soon as possible and requested he ring the officer to discuss this, no call was received and it is understood that Emma Sharkey ceased trading for the weekend.
- 55. On 27<sup>th</sup> April 2011, an application was eventually made to specify a change in DPS to Brian Lammond, this being nearly 1 month after the previous DPS had effectively left the premises.
- 56. Brian remained at the premises for approximately 3 months during which time no complaints were received.
- 57. In July 2011 an application was made to specify a change in DPS to Laura Guilfoyle
- 58. Laura remained at the premises for 2 years during which time 5 complaints relating to noise, rowdy behaviour and after hours drinking were received. (Details attached in document at Appendix 2).
- 59. During her time at the premises the police and local authority received a number of E-Mails from local residents complaining about activity at the premises and questioning what action the authorities would be taking.
- 60. The Police and Local authority also had cause to speak to Laura on a number of occasions relating to complaints received regarding after hours sales.
- 61. The first of these was on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2012, where Laura accepted offences had been committed and was given a warning explaining that any further offences would be dealt with more robustly.
- 62. The second occasion was on 19<sup>th</sup> February 2013 and was prompted as a result of a complaint and an E- mail sent by the local community beat manager.

- 63. At this meeting Laura maintained it was a private party however this was found not to be the case, in an attempt to prove after hours sales the till was checked however it had been disabled so evidence of sales was unavailable.
- 64. There were CCTV cameras visible in the bar area however enquiries revealed that there was no actual system installed so no evidence could be obtain through this medium.
- 65. In light of this the Business Development Manager, Stephen Lafferty was contacted by the police to highlight concerns regarding Laura's operation of the premises and that there was a consideration to review the licence to have her removed.
- 66. The BDM stated that Punch were also unhappy with her and that they were currently seeking legal action to remove her from the premises, however he also supported the suggestion that a review would assist removing her from the premises.
- 67. In light of the legal proceedings to remove Laura the police licensing officer felt that a review may not be the best course of action in relation to the premises and conveyed this view to Ford and Warren Solicitors.
- 68. Subsequently Punch obtained an eviction order, however Laura was able to remain at the premises and in light of this the potential for a review to remove her was again tendered by the BDM.
- 69. The police concerns over submitting a review was again conveyed to the BDM and he agreed to wait and see what transpired.
- 70. Laura Guilfoyle eventually left the premises in July 2013.
- 71. This was now the 9<sup>th</sup> manager in as many years, and in all but 2 cases complaints had been received regarding noise and disturbance to local residents.
- 72. The local community were now demanding action be taken relating to the premises and that this situation had been going on for too long and therefore the police gave an undertaking that should there be any further problems with the premises they would seek a review of the licence.
- 73. In July 2013 an application was received to specify a new DPS in the name of Angela Grogan.

- 74. Angela remained as DPS at the premises for 8 months however only operated the premises for the first 5 months.
- 75. In view of the number of DPS changes experienced at the premises and the problems reported by the local residents, they were reticent at the appointment of yet another manager.
- 76. In an attempt to try and build bridges between the community and the operator the police licensing officer held a meeting at the premises with Angela Grogan, Stephen Lafferty, Michaela Murray and a local resident.
- 77. At the meeting the officer outlined the ongoing issues with the premises, the problems experienced by the residents and the need to operate the premises without it impacting on the local community.
- 78. Angela gave assurances that she would run the premises without it impacting on the community, the conditions attached to the licence were outlined to her and the officer gave the undertaking to all present that this was in fact the last chance and should any further complaints relating to the premises be received then review proceedings would be instigated.
- 79. Angela operated the premises from July until December and during that time there were no complaints received, in fact a courtesy call to the local resident revealed that they were very happy with the premises at this time.
- 80. In December 2013 Angela left the premises, there was no notification given by either Angela or Punch, this only came to notice when the police licensing officer received an application to transfer the DPS at another premises in the name of Angela Grogan.
- 81. Having some concerns re this, Angela was contacted and asked why she was transferring from the premises; she stated she was getting no support from Punch.
- 82. The premises were closed and remained so over the Christmas and New Year period.
- 83. The next time the authorities became aware that the premises were trading was as a result of a complaint received from a local resident about excessive music coming from the premises. (Details attached in document at Appendix 2).
- 84. In response to this the police licensing officer contacted Stephen Lafferty and left a message on his answerphone outlining his disappointment that there

had been no communication regarding new operators, regarding the fact that the premises was operating and no change of DPS had been received.

- 85. It was also pointed out that as we had received a serious noise complaint, in light of the undertaking given in July there was no option but to now consider a review of the premises licence.
- 86. No contact was made by Stephen Lafferty at this time.
- 87. In light of this the officer in company with the licensing officer and environmental health officer from the local authority attended the premises to speak to the new operators.
- 88. They arrived at the premises at 10:20 hours and found the premises closed, there were lights on inside but no one could be found.
- 89. Upon attending the rear of the premises they found the rear doors insecure and were able to enter the premises, a check of the whole premises revealed that there was no one inside.
- 90. Being concerned that the premises were vulnerable a further call was made to Stephen Lafferty informing him that the premises were insecure and that he should contact the officer as soon as possible.
- 91. About 10 minutes later Stephen Lafferty contacted the officer, he stated he had received the first call but decided not to respond.
- 92. He also stated that he thought the premises were opening later that week but they had opened earlier and he didn't know about it.
- 93. He further conceded that it was his failure to make the DPS application, but that he would contact the new operators and have them attend the premises.
- 94. The new operators eventually attended the premises and they were spoken to by the officers, they gave their details as David Dursham and James Duffy.
- 95. They stated that they did have music on but that it wasn't loud, it was pointed out that it could be heard inside a residential property and that this was a breach of a condition attached to the licence.
- 96. It transpired that they had not been made aware of the conditions attached to the premises licence, nor were they able to produce the full premises licence or a certified copy of it as required under Section 57(2) Licensing Act 2003.

- 97. In light of this they were provided with a copy of the full licence and the conditions were outlined to them.
- 98. Police conducted some background checks in relation to Mr Dursham and Mr Duffy, it transpired that although Mr Dursham had stated he had previous experience of running licensed premises this was in fact a total of 4 months in 2009.
- 99. This raised concerns as both persons were relatively inexperienced and it was felt these premises needed experienced operators in light of previous issues at the premises.
- 100. At the time of writing Mr Dursham currently remains as DPS at the premises and other than the noise complaint there have been no other complaints received about the premises.

#### Police Observations

- There has, as can be seen, a historic problem with noise complaints connected with the premises, it is evident to note that these issues only seem to have arisen after the relaxation of the licensing hours under the Licensing . Act 2003.
- 2. It could be said that this is down to the fact that there have been a large number of changes in management and that this is to blame, this would be acknowledged by the police but they would say that the main responsibility for this lies with the Premises Licence Holder Punch Taverns.
- 3. The police would say that there appears to have been no consideration by the Premises Licence Holder as to the suitability of managers they have appointed.
- 4. Further to this they have not adequately provided their managers with sufficient information relating to the Premises Licence or conditions to enable them to operate in accordance with the licence.
- 5. It is apparent that managers are put into premises and the Pub companies are not providing them with the basic information required to operate the premises.
- 6. It is not unusual that when speaking with new managers it is found they have not been given a copy of the premises licence or been made aware of the conditions attached to the licence.

- 7. <u>This seems to be a common occurrence where premises are operated by pub</u> companies and as such the police now take a copy of the licence to all meetings with new operators to ensure they are aware of the constraints attached to that premises.
- 8. It would be easy to level the blame for these problems at individual managers but the police would state that the responsibility for the issues at the premises ultimately lie with the Premises Licence Holder.
- 9. The police do not feel there are any conditions that would address these issues and would say that the only way to address the problem would be a reduction in the operating hours of the premises.
- 10. To this end the police would recommend the following amendments be considered by the licensing committee;
  - Operating hours at the premises Mon to Sun 11:00 hrs to 23:00 hrs
  - Opening Hours of the premises Mon to Sun 11:00 hrs to 23:30 hrs
  - Removal of all regulated entertainment provision
  - Removal of the exemption for conditions relating to live music to have no effect as per Section 177(A)(3).

# ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

Supply of Alcohol

1.

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -
- At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or a)
- b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence, or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

#### Irresponsible promotions

- 1. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- 2. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children
  - games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to a) (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the
    - premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii)
- drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to b) a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and c) consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that d) provision is dependent on
  - the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or (i) (ii)
    - the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the e) premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

#### Dispensing of alcohol into the mouth

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another 1. (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

#### Free tap water

1. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

#### Exhibition of films

- 1. Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless (2) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendations made by that body
- 2. Where -
  - The film classification body is not specified in the licence, or a)
  - The Licensing Authority has notified the holder of the licence that this condition is applied to the film in b) auestion.

Admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the Licensing Authority.

#### Door Supervision

1. Any individual employed on the premises to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

# ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

An extension of 1 hour shall be permitted on the Saturday night and Sunday night of any weekend followed by a Bank Holiday Monday, Thursday prior to Good Friday and for Christmas Eve and Boxing Day.
Noise from music and associated sources (including D.J.s and amplified voices) shall not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises.
All external entrance doors and internal lobby doors shall be fitted with automatic self-closing devices, to be set or adjusted to ensure that doors do not bang shut.
The placing of refuse, such as bottles, into receptacles outside the premises shall take place between 8.00am and 10.00pm so as to prevent disturbance to nearby premises.
The exterior of the premises including the car park and external drinking areas shall be well lit.
There shall be a strict anti-drugs policy adopted and adhered to.
There shall be a selection of non-alcoholic drinks to promote anti drink driving policy.
There shall be a fire alarm in both public areas and private quarters.
There shall be fire extinguishers, illuminated exit signs and emergency lighting throughout the premises.
All food handlers shall hold Basic Food Hygiene Certificates.
All doors and windows shall be kept shut during any amplified entertainment.
Signs shall be placed at exits reminding customers to respect the neighborhood and depart quickly and quietly.
No unaccompanied children shall be allowed on the premises at any time.
All children shall be off the premises by 2100 one hour after final food orders are taken.

We are writing in support of the review of the license for the Town Green Inn, Town Green Lane, Aughton, Lancashire, as proposed by Sgt Anthony Bushell of West Lancashire Police.

We are residents who live in the two properties immediately behind the premises (27 and 29 Whalley Drive Aughton). For a number of years we have experienced nuisance from the premises under several different managers. This has included the following:

1. Excessively loud music from discos, karaoke and live bands into the early hours of the morning. We have one example of a party in summer of 2013 that went on until 3am, with many people congregating on the rear car park just behind our homes. Often the rear doors and windows have been opened, which has made the noise worse. We have complained to Environmental health on many occasions and kept noise diaries in order that action may be taken. We feel it is totally inappropriate for a village pub in a residential area to have a live music/ late night license and would welcome its withdrawal. We would welcome a restriction in the late night opening times of the premises and a return to closure at 11pm Monday to Saturday and 10:30 on Sundays.

2. Use of the rear car park as an unofficial and unauthorised 'beer garden' and a place for groups of drinkers and smokers to congregate during the day and in the evenings. We have often experienced noise nuisance as a result of this, including exposure of our children to foul language during the day, at weekends and early evening.

3. Piles of rubbish at the rear of the building, including food waste - attracting flies and vermin. This has been variable, depending upon the current management, but suggests that the premises have not been consistently well managed. We have also witnessed staff smoking from the upstairs windows at the premises.

4. A radio balanced on the open kitchen window at the rear of the premises causing noise nuisance.

5. Spotlights at the rear of the building that shone directly into the kitchens of our homes. These were left on permanently for a number of weeks but were switched off after an assessment by Environmental Health concluded that the lights were excessively bright and intrusive.

We are aware that action has been taken on a number of different managers by police, Environmental Health and Licensing. However, the premises has changed management on a number of occasions and the brewery (Punch Taverns) does not appear to have made sure that the same issues do not arise again and again. We feel that the only way to prevent the continuing nuisance from the premises is to review the licence to at least reduce the opening times to prevent late night nuisance and to withdraw all permission for live music, discos or karaoke. We would also welcome restriction in the use of the rear car park where people, continue to congregate to drink and smoke.

We look forward to a supportive and fair response from those considering this licensing review. Yours faithfully

Hi Michaela

I am writing with regards to the Town Green Inn, Aughton.

I believe the license is under review.

I would like to make you aware of the issues we have had with the pub from time to time, depending on what tenants are in place.

The brewery have a constant turnover of new licenses coming and going. They aren't vetted properly & I doubt the brewery know much about their back ground.

We have recently had to put up with awful noise pollution, resulting in myself and my husband calling the police. From 8pm through to 1am, the noise levels were 95 decibels. (We conducted a recording with a phone app on my husbands I phone). We could still hear the karaoke word for word even at the back of our house, through the double glazing and two internal doors.

I was in shock when I spoke to the landlord the following day to be told they had a license to hold a disco every Friday & Saturday until 1am.

I am shocked and dismayed that the council have agreed to this. Aughton is a small village, not a town centre. Holding a disco until 1am in the morning does not sit well with the residents. I cannot understand who is the right mind would pass this?!

I have spoken to neighbours who have had to move their bedrooms from the front of the house, to the back. This just isn't fair. These people have lived here for years and are pensioners. Although the pub has always been here, there was never this kind of issue years ago.

We worry every 6 months, who's next, who will the new tenants be, will they be worse than the last ones.

The pub itself looks a mess from the outside. It's supposed to be a village pub, but with the food signs outside, it looks somewhat down market. It's also not a very nice environment inside either.

I know the brewery are not making any money with the Town Green, maybe it's a dying hobby these days? The brewery have mentioned they are wanting to sell the pub to builders for renovations. Maybe his would be a better solution for all of us. I would lastly like to advise that since I asked the new landlords/tenants to respect the neighbourhood and keep the noise to a suitable level, to my knowledge, they have done so.



# TOWN GREEN INN, 17 TOWN GREEN LANE, AUGHTON, LANCASHIRE, L39 6SF

The grounds for the review are as follows:

"These premises have historically come to Police attention as a result of complaints from local residents. The complaints relate in the main to noise nuisance from entertainment, noise from customers and the premises operating after its authorized hours. The complaints have been investigated and warnings given where appropriate. However the premises has seen a number of changes of management and so the policy of issuing warnings in the first instance has meant that any enforcement process has had to be restarted when a new manager is appointed. This has effectively meant that no real action has been taken against the premises which has resulted in the local community suffering over a number of years.

In July 2013, after the departure of yet another manager who was responsible for a number of complaints relating to the premises, a meeting was held with the new manager and the representative for the Premises Licence Holder. At the meeting the police outlined that the situation could not continue and any further complaints relating to the premises would result in review proceedings being instigated.

The new manager operated the premises between July and December 2013 with no issues being reported, however she left and the premises was closed over Christmas and New Year.

In March 2014 new managers were placed into the premises and on 8<sup>th</sup> March a complaint was received by the police from a resident who was subjected to excessively loud music.

The Police are no longer prepared to carry on with issuing warnings as they have not previously provided a sustainable resolution to the problems. Therefore they have no option but to bring this to the attention to the Licensing Committee with a view to seeking a more long term sustainable solution."

The application may be inspected at West Lancashire Borough Council, Licensing Section, Robert Hodge Centre, Stanley Way, Skelmersdale, WN8 8EE between the hours of 9.00am and 4.30pm on Monday to Friday inclusive. Brief details can also be obtained from the Councils website <u>www.westlancs.gov.uk/</u>.

Dear Sir/Madam,

My wife and I have lived at number 11a Town Green Lane, the "nearest sensitive dwelling" to the Town Green Inn (the Pub), since we moved here from Ormskirk in 1971.

We brought up our family here and were happy to live alongside the Pub and use the facilities, without problems and without its activities adversely affecting our quality of life for years.

The Pub was redeveloped in 1999 by Dave Corrin (an ex policeman) and access provided to a new car park, through the ground floor of what was the end cottage, number 13.

This development was discussed with us by WLBC Planning Officers who built in a number of conditions to the Planning Consent to protect us and prevent the car park being used as a "beer garden". Mr Corrin was an excellent neighbour and living next to the Pub continued without problems until the change of the Premises Licence and tenancy in 2006.

We were astonished to learn some time later of the terms of the new Premises Licence, especially the inappropriate early morning hours to which it could open, so close to homes in a

quite village (Clause 3.6 of the WLBC Licensing Policy). It was only as we suffered the effects of the Licence and abuse of its conditions, by a succession of DPS/tenants, that we realised the appalling situation we and many of our neighbours had been placed in.

Had we have been afforded the level of consultation and transparency prior to the change of Licence, that we received in the Planning process, we and many of our neighbours would have been aware of the potential problems and as direct stakeholders, we would have raised our concerns in the hope that our representatives on the Licensing Committee would have

considered our interests and not just Punch (Clause 6.2 of the WLBC Licensing Policy).

Since 2006 we have had a succession of tenants "managing" the Pub, some lasting as little as six months and most just over a year. With the exception of Angie the tenant who gave up last December, as a result she said of lack of support from Punch, all have breached Licence and Planning conditions. On numerous occasions my wife and I have brought these breaches to the attention of Council Officers in Licensing ,Environmental Health and Planning, together with the Police. We have considered and suggested that we call for a Licence Review ourselves , but were advised at a number of meetings to leave it to the Council Officers. We have been advised that the Pub was on the "RAG" list and probably the "yellow card/red card" system, all to no avail.

Recording equipment has been supplied on a few occasions by Environmental Health and on one occasion the officer involved confirmed that the music and singing was excessive. However the equipment is often not available or broken. Last time we asked for it, two out of three were broken and to be replaced by new units. This Licence and the effects of its abuse have been extremely stressful for both of us and we have often felt powerless to get anything done.

Now that the County Police have requested a Review ,we are delighted to support that application. You will see in our evidence pack (supplied in hard copy) records of;-

- 22 examples when we have telephoned the Police to respond to noise, music and disturbance at the Pub.
- 121 nuisance events, recorded by my wife over the years and now transposed onto Council forms (original records available).
- 23 extracts from our email records, with the worst examples highlighted, together with some copy photographs.

Hopefully these will give the Committee an insight into the continuing problems we have suffered as a result of noise, disturbance, loud music and singing, often into the early hours of the morning. We have been prevented from getting to sleep, woken up during our sleep with parties going on until as late as 4.00am, and then woken again again early in the morning when the bottles are collected from the Pub ( outside consented hours).

For years, one tenant after another ignored Licence and Planning rules and operated a "beer garden" in the rear car park, which meant that in addition to late night abuse of our right to the quiet enjoyment of our property, we had to endure it in the afternoons and early evenings. We have had hens and rabbits kept in the car park to encourage parents to bring children in. Five a side football played in the car park and even an inflatable go-kart arena, with gokarts! My wife is a retired teacher and Chair of Trustees at a local Children's Nursery and she has expressed concern about young children being allowed to play in the car park, while cars are coming and going. Polite attempts by us to ask tenants to stop this practice was usually met with verbal abuse, and requests by Council Officers for tenants to display signs to protect children have been ignored.

Often in the good weather we could not sit outside in the afternoons or evenings, or allow our grandchildren to do so, because of bad language and noise from those drinking outside in the car park. In the warm weather if there is entertainment on at the Pub we have to sleep with our bedroom windows closed to reduce the noise, which can usually be clearly heard, and we use fans to keep cool. Four years ago we acquired a second hand caravan to get away at weekends for some peace and quiet and a decent night's sleep.

The Law and WLBC Licensing Policy is clear about Public Nuisance, and the Home Office Amended Guidance to Section 182 of the 2003 Act, clause 2.3 states that it is "important to recognise that the prevention of nuisance includes low level nuisance affecting a few people in the locality, as well as major disturbances" We may only be a few people, but we have suffered sustained nuisance for an extended period of time as a result of abuse of the liberal hours allowed in Premises Licence.

The Planning Officer involved with us was the first to recognise that continuing to pursue successive individual tenants over breaches, was not the answer and that decisive action was required, also involving Punch. Throughout

this whole affair Punch have, in our opinion, been totally lacking in any sense of social responsibility, effective management, selection or training of managers/tenants/DPS' in their responsibilities to understand and comply with Licensing and Planning regulations. As further evidence of the lack of commitment by Punch the Pub was put up For Sale only a few weeks ago and we know of at least one builder who has contacted the Estate Agent in Manchester, to express interest in buying the Pub to convert it back into domestic dwellings. Action has been taken by Planning and we sincerely hope that a Licence Review, by the Licensing Committee, will lead to a substantial change in the Premises Licence.

The Committee will be better placed than us to know the courses of action available to it, but we believe that there needs to be a reduction in operating hours at the Pub, to 23.00hrs weekdays and midnight at weekends and bank holidays. No electronically amplified music or singing, other than low level background music ( as at the Swan Hotel Aughton). All of which incidentally was the case for over 30 years in our experience and the Pub was busy, successful and never a nuisance.

#### Record of when the Police have been telephoned to report excessive noise at the Town Green Inn.

On advice my wife has kept a record of incidences of noise nuisance from the Town Green Pub, and as well as contact in recent times with Sergeant Bushell we have telephoned the Police on a number of occasions to report the noise issues in the hope that they could attend and do something about the problem.

Detailed below are extracts from my wife's notes which provide examples of when we telephoned the Police after having first telephoned the Pub:-

07/12/06. 23.15hrs loud music.

14/12/06. 23.00hrs loud music and singing.

29/12/06. 23.30hrs loud music and singing. Our neighbours Mr & Mrs Prescott complained from no 5 Town green lane.

01/06/07. 00.05 am loud music early hours of  $2^{nd}$ .

14/06/07. 23.25hrs loud music.

18/07/07. 22.45hrs ---: ----

31/10/07. 03.00hrs noise still going on in the early hours of 1<sup>st</sup> Nov. Police Log 395 (1/11/07)

31/05/08. 00.15hrs Loud music early hours of 1<sup>st</sup>.

07/06/08. 00.15hrs Loud music early hours of 8<sup>th</sup>. Police Log 24.

14/08/08. 00.00hrs ---: --- Police Log 2084.

25/10/08. 00.15hrs Loud music early hours of 26<sup>th</sup>. Police Log 42.

27/10/08. 00.15hrs Loud music phoned Police, Log 12930?

08/10/10. 23.50hrs Loud music called Police , couldn't get a log number at first, told it was for Environmental Health, eventually got Log 2185. Still noisy at 00.45hrs.

08/04/11. 23.00hrs Loud music and shouting , been going on since early evening, punters back from the Races. Like a party going on in our own bedroom, rang Police to no avail.

Complained to Licensing and Environmental health by email.

11/04/09. Loud music, time of call not recorded, but reported to Police.

24/04/09. Loud music and cars parked blocking our drive. Rang Police and emailed Environmental Health.

08/10/09. Loud music. Police Log 2185.

05/12/10. 11.40am Sunday morning violent domestic argument in car park of Pub, rang Police out of concern for the woman involved. There had also been a noisy argument on the night

of the previous Friday.

03/10/11. Loud music and singing rang the Police at 23.00hrs and music stopped abruptly about 20 minutes later. Police rang on 4th to confirm that they had visited the Pub.

01/09/12. 02.40 Woken up by raucous shouting, banging doors and peoples voices. This continued and at 03.30 I dressed and went to investigate, to find that the Pub was busy and customers were still drinking. I asked people at the rear door to keep the noise down and one shouted back "sorry". I rang the Police, who attended at about 04.20 but accepted that it was a private party! This was later rejected by the Community Policeman, who reported the matter to senior officers. I also reported it to the Licensing officers, but never received a satisfactory response on what action would be taken.

17/02/13. 03.00hrs Sunday morning, woken up by loud voices, music sounded like a party going on. Rang the Police, who attended. Log 254. Told them we had been woken up the previous Sunday morning at 02.00hrs as well.

**NB.** Following on from the above our contact with the Police has been directly with designated officers and we have had discussions with the local Community Police Officer, followed by meetings with Sergeant Bushell and correspondence with him and his Regional Inspector Christina Shorrock.


Before speaking to you I had earlier spoken to your colleague and asked if an Officer could call out to witness the breach of Consent, personally.



Thank you for your email regaring the sale of alcohol and I apologise for not responding sooner but i have had some IT issues.

Does the situation you describe not undermine the whole purpose of licensing and mean that a landlord could keep a licenesed premises open every night of the week, for private parties? A charter for "lock-ins" and onus would always be on the Police to prove if the alcohol was being paid for, or not.

During your investigation with Sergeant Bushell, did you ask about the incident the previous. Is it weekend, that I referred to in my email to Michaela Murray. I look forward to hearing from you with the result of your investigations.

I note that we didn't get any response to our complaint last September, when we were woken at 2.40 am and acitivities in the pub continued until 4.20 am (I will forward it again).

These are not the only incidents, but the ones we have brought to the attention of the Licensing Authority.

Surely the noise and nuisance caused by activities in this pub (usually in the early hours) are contrary to one of the four main objectives of the Act and the Licensing Policy of the Council. Under Home Office Ammended Guidance to Section 182 of the 2003 Act it states in 2.34 that it is important to recognise that the prevention of niusance includes low level nuisance affecting a few people in the locality as well as major disturbances.

Michaela,

You may recall all the problems we have had over the past six or seven years with breaches of licence conditions and noise nuisance from the ever changing incumbents at

the pub next door. Planning has taken some action and the use of the rear car park as a drinking area has significantly reduced. It is also fair to say that in our opinion the current operaters of the pub have been the least problematical, with noise audible on occasions in our home but most of the time not too great a nuisance, until the early hours of last Saturday morning.

We were woken up by shouting and raucous conversation at about 2:40.am, doors were banging and we assumed that late revellers were leaving the pub. However, the noise and doors intermittently banging continued and as we were unable to sleep I got dressed and went out at about 3:300 to see what was going on. The curtains were closed at the front of the pub, but lights

were on and a window at the south end of the building was not curtained and I could clearly see people drinking. People were outside at the rear door smoking and windows were open at the rear. At 15.35 a taxi (no 1186) pulled up to collect some of the revellers. I went back in thinking it was over, but at 4:00 am shouted over the wall to a noisy group of three to please keep the noise down as we were trying to sleep. A woman shouted "sorry". I had reported the problem to the police and at about 4:20 they spoke to the individuals concerned ( according to the Community Policeman when he contacted me.later).

I assume that you will have had confirmation of this incident from the police and I would be grateful to know what action is taken. I sincerely hope the private party excuse will not excuse this blatant breach of Licence Conditions and Environmental Protection Act.

We will be on holiday from today, but I will contact you again when we return if we haven't had a response.

Presumably you saw the table they sat around drinking all day and up until 11.30 last night, at which time I complained forcefully. The table still had beer glasses on this morning although it is likely that when you called they had been cleared. I will forward a photograph to Peter Foster that I took this morning, before it was cleared.

The table is still there this afternoon, but I notice that so far it only has tea or coffee cups on it, if that actually makes a difference?!

Were you able to get any answers on the question of notices which the pub should be displaying or if and when the pub ownership is changing?

Good afternoon Michaela, I write to confirm the latest problems with, what in our opionion are breaches of Licence Conditions at the Town Green Inn. We were woken up just before 3:00am on Sunday-morning by noise from the pub, back door banging people talking and shouting in the car park. I looked through the window and it appeared that the pub was still open for business. I put some clothes on and went out into the Lane and saw a couple leaving the premises. All the front and south side windows had closed curtains (but through the first rear window: I.could clearly see a crowd of people; many of whom were drinking and music was playing. At that time there were five or six cars parked in the car park and one outside the front. I reported my complaint to the Police and was given a call log (254 at 3.21 am on 17/1/13)? together with an assurance that they would try to send a vehicle. In fact within minutes two Police vehicles arrived and I assume the officers went inside the pub.

As I indicated on the phone, the latest incident with the pub was last Friday 1/4/11.

There was a karaoke and the volume was reasonable except when doors were opened.

Between 11.00 and 11.30 the noise from customers was particularly loud outside the rear of the pub (presumably smokers drinking outside). Three or four men were very loud and one woman was singing.

We eventually got to sleep but were woken up at 00.45 by bottles being emptied into the bottle bin outside. I recall this is a breach of the licence.



#### Michaela,

You asked me to keep you informed of any further incidents at the Pub, so here goes:-

We are unaware of any problems on 29th (Royal Wedding) or 30th April as we were away. We returned at about 16.30 on Sunday 1st May and couldn't help but notice the cacophony of noise from the car park of the Pub. When I looked over the wall additional seating had been put out across the north end of the car park to accommodate additional customers.

What was of even more concern to us was that a number of children and youths were playing football in the car park. The noise of the ball banging against walls and floor is annoying but as parents and grandparents we were more concerned about safety. Surely the management has a duty of care in this situation? The football continued and when I looked from our bedroom window, I was astonished to see that the numbers of players had increased and some were wearing black and white football strip! From what I could see players numbered 6,4 and 8 were involved but there could have been others. They were playing in and out of the north entrance to the car park, under what was the end cottage (no13), which amplified the noise. This all continued for the next hour or more and on one of the occasions that I looked there was also a young girl wandering about the car park with a drink in her hand.

The Pub was substantially altered in 1999, planning permission was granted to demolish the ground floor of the north end cottage to allow access and egress to the new car park, which was also subject to that planning consent. I was involved as part of the consultation process and in a site meeting with Mr Rothwell the Planning Officer, it was stated by him that consent, if given, would be for a car park and not a "beer garden". Thereby allying one of our concerns. In view of recent events it is my intention to seek clarification from the WLBC

Planning Department. Incidentally, LCC Highways Dept are currently addressing the problems of parking in Town Green Lane and filling car parking spaces with three, four or more tables in the Pub car park can only exacerbate the problems.

Friday 6th May, was music night and initially the disco/karaoke did not cause a nuisance.

However by 21.30 it was getting louder so I checked and noted that two windows were open at the rear ground floor. I checked later and they were still open. I walked past the front at about 22.15 and the front door was open, with three men sheltering from the rain in the porch. We went to bed at around 23:00 hrs we but were unable to get to sleep as the music got louder the later it got, despite the Licence conditions. They last two numbers we could clearly hear in our bedroom around 24.00 hrs were "Valerie", which a female of was singing followed by "Hey did you happen to see the most beautiful girl in the World" sung by a male/( I recorded these).

Nothing much changes despite all your efforts to explain licence obligations.

Saturday 7th, we were sitting in our conservatory when we could hear a football being banged about again. After a while I looked over the wall to find a man playing ball with a young boy in the car park. I politely asked them to stop and pointed out the danger of playing in a car park. It stopped for about five minutes and then started again.

Sunday 8th, football was also played again this afternoon. The adult went back into the Pub and the Young boy (black top with no3 on the arm) continued on his own.

I intend to raise my concerns with the Health & Safety Executive.

In your email of 19/4/11 you mentioned that you were going to speak to Andrew about recording equipment, has there been any response yet as we have not heard anything? Also have you had any response or comment from Sgt Bushell? Kind regards,

Does the Town Green's licence restrict the movement of bottles before 8am? I have not been too well and this morning I had just fallen asleep again when at 7-29am the bottles from inside were emptied into the bin at the side of our house. This then happened twice more before 7-55am.

We are still suffering with loud music heard in our bedroom on Thursdays so it is impossible to go to bed early or at a reasonable time: I am concerned that with the run up to Christmas more "musical" evening are planned. It was exceptionally noisy at Hallowe'en. We did contact the Police again at 12-15am on the 26th October (log no 12930). The Police Liason contacted us re our complaints over the last year and advised us to keep doing this. I have also spoken to our community Policeman, Ken Lees.

I am now at the end of my tether and would be grateful of your assistance and advise.

Thank you for consulting me with regard to this premises licence review application.

In support of the application I will detail the complaints or calls received by this service over the course of approximately six years with respect to noise from the Town Green Inn. There have been 4 separate complainants over the years from residents in Town Green Lane or Whalley Drive. The timing of the complaints has always been consistent with a change of tenant or designated responsible person. The complaints have dealt with both informally and formally through a planning notice. Therefore I feel it appropriate to call for a review of the premises licence in light of the information below in order to prevent a reoccurrence of the same problems that arise each time the occupancy of the premise changes hands.

On the 10/03/2014 the service received a complaint from a resident of Town Green Lane. The complainant left a message to discuss noise from the Town Green Pub over the weekend, following a change in tenant. Letters and diary sheets were sent to both parties.

On the same day I Visited the Town Green Inn with Michaela Murray and Sgt Bushell, we entered the premise as the rear door was unlocked but there was nobody present. After waiting for some 20 minutes I left as Sgt Bushell was trying to contact the tenants as the premise was vulnerable so he was reluctant to leave.

On the 11/03/14 the complainant sent in a video recording which was taken outside on the evening in question. The music playing was clearly audible in the street above the noise of the passing traffic.

Diary sheets have not been returned and there have been no further complaints from this resident since. There was also a previous complaint from this address on the 19/10/10 with respect to people noise which had been resolved informally.

On the 09/08/13 a complaint was taken from a resident of Whalley Drive, stating the pub car park was being used as a beer garden and that since the early afternoon people had been outside shouting and drinking, and that at 9:20 pm there were still large amounts of people still there as if there was a party outside. As a consequence the windows to the children's bedroom had to be shut because of bad language and noise levels.

On the 07/07/13 the department received an earlier complaint from the above address. The complaint was with regard to loud party noise from the Town Green Inn from late Saturday 6th July to 03:00am Sunday 7th July. The complainant stated that the noise was disturbing their sleep and the sleep of the two young children whose bedroom overlooks the premises at the bottom of their garden. The complainant also stated that the doors and windows at the rear of the building were all open with a crowd of drunken people congregated at the back of the building drinking, smoking, shouting and using foul language, which her children could hear.

On the 11/07/13 the department received a message to say the tenant was leaving the premises the following day.

The same resident has made previous complaints, one being on the 17/09/12 regarding a live music event on the 14/09/12, were upon loud music could be heard at 11:25 until 11:40. The rear doors were said to be propped open and therefore no noise was contained.

Prior to that a complaint was received on the 29/05/2012 with respect to constant music noise all day from inside the pub on Sunday 27/05/12, and people congregating at the rear to smoke and drink, despite no permission for a beer garden there and the rear doors being left open from 10am until gone 10pm. Neighbour stated this was disturbing her and her young sons and was concerned as music was accompanied by shouting and swearing that her son could hear due to the location of their bedroom.

The first complaint from this address was taken on the 03/09/11 with respect to noise from a live music event.

On the 26/04/11 the service received a complaint with respect to loud music from a different address on Town Green Lane.

On the 12 /10/10 a different resident of Town Green Lane complained to the service regarding noise from the pub resulting from music and customers alleged to be heard in his home, following a change of tenant. After initial letters were sent the resident made several subsequent complaints which resulted in the installation of noise monitoring equipment on 3 occasions. The second attempt revealed that noise from the pub was clearly audible in the complainant's property. However as the DPS was not in fact the leaseholder on the occasion in question is was felt disproportionate to serve a Noise Abatement Notice as the leaseholder who was responsible at the time had acrimoniously left the pub.

Prior to this a complaint was taken on the 10/08/09 from the same address again regarding music & people noise. Noise recording equipment was installed and no nuisance was witnessed. The officer dealing with the complaint liaised with the tenant and the case was resolved informally.

On the 06/06/08 the service took a complaint from same address with respect to loud music on Friday & Saturday nights and noise from the weekly collection of the bottle bin. This was resolved informally.

The earliest complaint was received from the same address on the 10/12/2007 which was linked to the complaint above.

Planning Services supports the review application, as the attached notices reflect the problems that have required enforcement action since 2011, particularly in breach of condition 5 of the 30th September 1999 planning permission 1999/0558 for a single-storey extension and fire exit staircase at the rear; use of the first floor as guest accommodation; the provision of a parking area at the rear; and the demolition of part of the ground floor to provide a through vehicular access. This condition states: *No part of the land to the rear of the building shall be used for outside drinking.* In complete disregard of the condition outside drinking has been taking place on the land to the rear of the building and this is being facilitated by the provision of tables and benches.

Having issued two BCNs (due to the DPS changing as BCNs have to be served on those responsible for the breach) the matter was reported to the Planning Committee in November 2011:

- 6.1 Town Green Inn is a predominantly stone built, two-storey, detached public house located on the southern side of Town Green Lane within the main Aughton settlement area. There is a dedicated car park at the rear of the building. The boundaries are well established with good screening to the rear by high hedging.
- 6.2 In 1999 planning permission (1999/0558) was granted, subject to 8 conditions, for a single-storey extension and fire exit staircase at the rear; use of the first floor as guest accommodation; the provision of a parking area at the rear; and the demolition of part of the ground floor to provide a through vehicular access. Condition 5 states:

No part of the land to the rear of the building shall be used for outside drinking. The reason for the condition was to safeguard the amenity of adjacent properties and the area generally

6.3 The Council has received complaints that tables and benches have been placed on the car park at the rear of the building and that outside drinking is taking place. Despite requests to cease these activities the practice continues. Therefore, a breach of condition notice (E/2011/0147/BCN) was served in the first instance on the 21st July 2011 on the Designated Premises Supervisor, given she has the responsibility to ensure the conditions are complied with. However, this has proved not to be effective in resolving the breach, as the person occupying that role has since changed, so a new notice was issued on the 18th October 2011.

The EN was issued on the 7th December 2011 and came into effect on the 25th January 2012 as no appeal was submitted. The notice required that within one month of the effective date the use of the land at the rear of the building for outside drinking

should cease and the tables and benches removed from the land at the rear of the building. The notice has continuing effect and having complied with the notice does not allow the use to resume.

The BCNs have similar requirements to be done within twenty-eight days beginning on the day on which this notice is served:

- 1. Cease the use of the land to the rear of the building for outside drinking.
- 2. Remove the tables and benches

However, in 2012 Planning Services informed the brewery that licensing officers had witnessed a breach of the enforcement notice and this must not re-occur or a file will be prepared and sent to Legal Services to consider the case for prosecution. At the same time a third breach of condition notice was issued, this time on the brewery, as the Designated Premises Supervisor was changing yet again due to the problems being dealt with by Licensing.

As BCNs are issued on the person responsible for the breach and there is no right of appeal, Planning Services decided this was a reasonable option at that time given the brewery was involved with the licensing issues and so was seen to be responsible for the activities. This was more evident in 2012 than it was when the previous BCNs were issued. The brewery had a month to comply and this meant that any breach of condition occurring after that date would enable the case to be put to Legal Services to consider whether it is the public interest to prosecute.





### SUBJECT: ENFORCEMENT ITEMS

### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To bring to Members' attention those alleged breaches of planning control where a decision needs to be made as to whether authorisation be given to issue formal notices.

### 2. **RECOMMENDATION**

- 2.1 (a) That the Borough Solicitor be authorised to issue notices of the types and under the Sections of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 as set out below, requiring the steps to be taken within the time periods and for the reasons, all as set out below.
  - (b) That the Borough Solicitor be authorised to take proceedings where any steps required by the notice are not taken within the period for compliance and the Borough Planner be authorised to enter the land and take those steps. In the event of the Borough Planner having to take such action, he be authorised to recover the expenses reasonably incurred.
  - (c) That the Borough Solicitor be authorised to withdraw, vary and re-issue notices if subsequent information indicates this to be necessary. OR
  - (d) That no further action be taken.

### 3. BACKGROUND

3.1 Apart from report 4 the following are the alleged breaches of planning control on sites where I consider authorisation to issue notices would be appropriate. As with all such cases, I shall, during implementation of the appropriate procedures, continue to negotiate to try and achieve removal of the breaches without the need for formal action. Condition 5 states: No part of the land to the rear of the building shall be used for outside drinking.

The reason for the condition was to safeguard the amenity of adjacent properties and the area generally

- 6.3 The Council has received complaints that tables and benches have been placed on the car park at the rear of the building and that outside drinking is taking place. Despite requests to cease these activities the practice continues. Therefore, a breach of condition notice (E/2011/0147/BCN) was served in the first instance on the 21st July 2011 on the Designated Premises Supervisor, given she has the responsibility to ensure the conditions are complied with. However, this has proved not to be effective in resolving the breach, as the person occupying that role has since changed, so a new notice was issued on the 18th October 2011.
- 6.4 Given the above problems I consider the issue of an enforcement notice will add belt and braces support to the breach of condition notices (BCN) and avoid the possibility of having to issue a further BCN.
- 6.5 Type of notice Enforcement notice under section 172

Compliance period – One month

Steps to be taken:

- 1. Cease the use of the land at the rear of the building for outside drinking.
- 2. Remove the tables and benches from the land at the rear of the building.

Reason for issuing the notice:







Miss Grogan seemed willing to work with the Fire Authority to remedy the defiencies and seemed a suitable person to manage the premises.

It is understood that the premises has been provided with a new DPS.

It is not planned to perform a Fire Safety Audit until any review is completed.

Due to the history of the premises, it is the Fire Authority's view that:-

- 1) It is unlikely that any schedule of work has been implemented.
- 2) It is unlikely that the premises will be compliant with the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005.
- 3) It is unlikely that due regard will be given to public safety.
- 4) It is unlikely that the present occupiers will be present long enough, or have inclination, to complete any schedule of works.
