### FIRE EVACUATION PROCEDURE FOR: COUNCIL MEETINGS WHERE OFFICERS ARE PRESENT (52 DERBY STREET, ORMSKIRK)

**PERSON IN CHARGE:** Most Senior Officer Present

**ZONE WARDEN:** Member Services Officer / Lawyer

**DOOR WARDEN(S)** Usher / Caretaker

### IF YOU DISCOVER A FIRE

1. Operate the nearest **FIRE CALL POINT** by breaking the glass.

2. Attack the fire with the extinguishers provided only if you have been trained and it is safe to do so. **Do not** take risks.

### ON HEARING THE FIRE ALARM

- 1. Leave the building via the **NEAREST SAFE EXIT. Do not stop** to collect personal belongings.
- 2. Proceed to the **ASSEMBLY POINT** on the car park and report your presence to the **PERSON IN CHARGE.**
- 3. **Do NOT** return to the premises until authorised to do so by the PERSON IN **CHARGE.**

### NOTES:

Officers are required to direct all visitors regarding these procedures i.e. exit routes and place of assembly.

The only persons not required to report to the Assembly Point are the Door Wardens.

### **CHECKLIST FOR PERSON IN CHARGE**

- 1. Advise other interested parties present that you are the person in charge in the event of an evacuation.
- 2. Make yourself familiar with the location of the fire escape routes and informed any interested parties of the escape routes.
- 3. Make yourself familiar with the location of the assembly point and informed any interested parties of that location.
- 4. Make yourself familiar with the location of the fire alarm and detection control panel.
- 5. Ensure that the zone warden and door wardens are aware of their roles and responsibilities.
- 6. Arrange for a register of attendance to be completed (if considered appropriate / practicable).

### IN THE EVENT OF A FIRE, OR THE FIRE ALARM BEING SOUNDED

- 1. Ensure that the room in which the meeting is being held is cleared of all persons.
- 2. Evacuate via the nearest safe Fire Exit and proceed to the **ASSEMBLY POINT** in the car park.
- 3. Delegate a person at the **ASSEMBLY POINT** who will proceed to **HOME CARE LINK** in order to ensure that a back-up call is made to the **FIRE BRIGADE**.
- 4. Delegate another person to ensure that **DOOR WARDENS** have been posted outside the relevant Fire Exit Doors.

- 5. Ensure that the **ZONE WARDEN** has reported to you on the results of his checks, **i.e.** that the rooms in use have been cleared of all persons.
- 6. If an Attendance Register has been taken, take a **ROLL CALL**.
- 7. Report the results of these checks to the Fire and Rescue Service on arrival and inform them of the location of the **FIRE ALARM CONTROL PANEL**.
- 8. Authorise return to the building only when it is cleared to do so by the **FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE OFFICER IN CHARGE**. Inform the **DOOR WARDENS** to allow re-entry to the building.

### NOTE:

The Fire Alarm system will automatically call the Fire Brigade. The purpose of the 999 back-up call is to meet a requirement of the Fire Precautions Act to supplement the automatic call.

### **CHECKLIST FOR ZONE WARDEN**

- 1. Carry out a physical check of the rooms being used for the meeting, including adjacent toilets, kitchen.
- 2. Ensure that **ALL PERSONS**, both officers and members of the public are made aware of the **FIRE ALERT**.
- 3. Ensure that ALL PERSONS evacuate IMMEDIATELY, in accordance with the FIRE EVACUATION PROCEDURE.
- 4. Proceed to the **ASSEMBLY POINT** and report to the **PERSON IN CHARGE** that the rooms within your control have been cleared.
- 5. Assist the **PERSON IN CHARGE** to discharge their duties.

It is desirable that the **ZONE WARDEN** should be an **OFFICER** who is normally based in this building and is familiar with the layout of the rooms to be checked.

### **INSTRUCTIONS FOR DOOR WARDENS**

- 1. Stand outside the **FIRE EXIT DOOR(S)**
- 2. Keep the **FIRE EXIT DOOR SHUT.**
- 3. Ensure that **NO PERSON**, whether staff or public enters the building until **YOU** are told by the **PERSON IN CHARGE** that it is safe to do so.
- 4. If anyone attempts to enter the premises, report this to the **PERSON IN CHARGE.**
- 5. Do not leave the door **UNATTENDED.**

'disclosable pecuniary interest' (DPI) means an interest of a description specified below which is your interest, your spouse's or civil partner's or the interest of somebody who you are living with as a husband or wife, or as if you were civil partners and you are aware that that other person has the interest.

### Interest

### Prescribed description

Employment, office, trade, profession or vocation

Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain.

Sponsorship

Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from the relevant authority) made or provided within the relevant period in respect of any expenses incurred by M in carrying out duties as a member, or towards the election expenses of M.

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This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning

of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

Contracts Any contract which is made between the relevant person (or a body in which the

relevant person has a beneficial interest) and the relevant authority-

(a) under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and

(b) which has not been fully discharged.

Land Any beneficial interest in land which is within the area of the relevant authority.

Licences Any licence (alone or jointly with others) to occupy land in the area of the relevant

authority for a month or longer.

Corporate tenancies Any tenancy where (to M's knowledge)—

(a) the landlord is the relevant authority; and

(b) the tenant is a body in which the relevant person has a beneficial interest.

Securities Any beneficial interest in securities of a body where—

(a) that body (to M's knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of the relevant authority; and

(b) either-

(i) the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or

(ii) if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which the relevant person has a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

"body in which the relevant person has a beneficial interest" means a firm in which the relevant person is a partner or a body corporate of which the relevant person is a director, or in the securities of which the relevant person has a beneficial interest; "director" includes a member of the committee of management of an industrial and provident society:

"land" excludes an easement, servitude, interest or right in or over land which does not carry with it a right for the relevant person (alone or jointly with another) to occupy the land or to receive income; "M" means a member of a relevant authority;

"member" includes a co-opted member; "relevant authority" means the authority of which M is a member;

"relevant period" means the period of 12 months ending with the day on which M gives notice to the Monitoring Officer of a DPI; "relevant person" means M or M's spouse or civil partner, a person with whom M is living as husband or wife or a person with whom M is living as if they were civil partners;

"securities" means shares, debentures, debenture stock, loan stock, bonds, units of a collective investment scheme within the meaning of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000 and other securities of any description, other than money deposited with a building society.

'non pecuniary interest' means interests falling within the following descriptions:

- 10.1(1)(i) Any body of which you are a member or in a position of general control or management and to which you are appointed or nominated by your authority;
  - (ii) Any body (a) exercising functions of a public nature; (b) directed to charitable purposes; or (c) one of whose principal purposes includes the influence of public opinion or policy (including any political party or trade union), of which you are a member or in a position of general control or management;
  - (iii) Any easement, servitude, interest or right in or over land which does not carry with it a right for you (alone or jointly with another) to occupy the land or to receive income.
- A decision in relation to that business might reasonably be regarded as affecting your well-being or financial position or the well-being or financial position of a connected person to a greater extent than the majority of other council tax payers, ratepayers or inhabitants of the ward, as the case may be, affected by the decision.

### 'a connected person' means

- (a) a member of your family or any person with whom you have a close association, or
- (b) any person or body who employs or has appointed such persons, any firm in which they are a partner, or any company of which they are directors;
- (c) any person or body in whom such persons have a beneficial interest in a class of securities exceeding the nominal value of £25,000; or
- (d) any body of a type described in sub-paragraph 10.1(1)(i) or (ii).

### 'body exercising functions of a public nature' means

Regional and local development agencies, other government agencies, other Councils, public health bodies, council-owned companies exercising public functions, arms length management organisations carrying out housing functions on behalf of your authority, school governing bodies.

A Member with a personal interest who has made an executive decision in relation to that matter must ensure any written statement of that decision records the existence and nature of that interest.

**NB** Section 21(13) of the LGA 2000 overrides any Code provisions to oblige an executive member to attend an overview and scrutiny meeting to answer questions.

## 8 APPLICATION FOR A NEW PREMISES LICENCE IN RESPECT OF ORMSKIRK INDOOR MARKET

Consideration was given to the report of the Corporate Director Of Place and Community as contained on pages 43 to 88 of the Book of Reports in respect of an Application for a new Premises Licence from Ormskirk Market Limited (the

Applicant) submitted under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 (the 2003 Act). This application was in respect of Ormskirk Indoor Market, Moorgate, Ormskirk, West Lancashire L39 4RT (the Premises).

### **RESOLVED:**

### APPLICATION GRANTED SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING:

### **ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS:**

In addition to the Conditions proposed by the Police and Environmental Protection and accepted by the Applicant, the following conditions should be applied to the Premises Licence:

- 1. That contact details of the Designated Premises Supervisor and the Premises Licence Holder shall be made available to staff and Responsible Authorities at all times.
- 2. That a contact telephone number for the premises will be displayed on the front window/door of the Premises to allow anyone who wishes to report an issue directly to the premises to do so. The said telephone must remain operational at all times licensable activities are taking place.

### POLICE CONDITIONS

1. A documented Challenge 25 scheme will be the adopted Age Verification Policy operated at the premises. The Challenge 25 scheme will be actively promoted and advertised at the premises and suitable signage will be in place. Any person purchasing alcohol, who appears to be under 25 years of age, shall be asked to provide acceptable identification to prove that they are 18 years of age or over. Failure to supply such identification will result in no sale or supply of alcohol to that person and the refusal shall be recorded in the dedicated Refusals Register which must be made available for inspection by any responsible authority upon request

Acceptable forms of identification: -

- a) Photo Driving Licence
- b) Passport
- c) National, including EU Identity Cards
- d) A PASS accredited holographic proof of age card
- e) Any other identification agreed with police licensing

The DPS or nominated person shall ensure that all staff members involved in the sale of alcohol are trained upon commencing employment and refresher training delivered at least one per annum or upon the request of any responsible authority. The training records shall be kept on site and shall be produced for viewing upon the request of any responsible authority.

- 2. The premises shall operate and maintain a digital CCTV system which shall be in use during all times licensable activities are taking place at the premises and comply as follows: -
- a) The system shall cover all entrances, exits and emergency exits from the premises, in addition to providing recordings from all internal and external areas of the premises used to supply or consume licensed products
- b) The focus of the camera(s) shall be positioned to enable clear identification of persons on the premises
- c) The system will be capable of making correct time and date stamped recordings and retaining said recordings for at least 28 days
- d) The Data Controller shall make footage available for viewing and downloading to a Police Officer or authorised officer where such a request is made in accordance with the principles of the Data Protection Act or any subsequent or alternative legislation
- e) Signage advising that CCTV is in operation will be displayed
- 3. Whenever the premises trade beyond midnight for the sale of alcohol, the number of door supervisors employed at the premises will be as follows: -
- a) Sunday, to Wednesday The DPS or a nominated person shall carry out a risk assessment of the premises to determine whether door supervisors are required.
- b) Thursday, to Saturday There shall be a minimum of 2 SIA registered door supervisors employed from 2000hrs until close of premises. The DPS or a nominated person shall carry out a risk assessment of the premises to determine whether further door supervisors are required.
- c) Any bank holiday, public holiday or day preceding these There shall be a minimum of 2 SIA registered door supervisors employed from 2000hrs until close of premises. The DPS or nominated person shall carry out a risk assessment of the premises to determine whether further door supervisors are required.
- d) The risk assessment for the provision of door supervisors shall be a written one.

Such risk assessment shall be conducted for the normal running of the business and shall be carried out on a not less than yearly basis. All risk assessments shall be kept on the premises for 12 months from the date of assessment and shall be produced to Responsible Authority Officer or Police Officer on request.

- 4. Any sales of alcohol made for consumption off the premises will be made in a sealed container
- 5. Notices shall be displayed at public exits, in a clear prominent position, requesting that patrons respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and area quietly
- 6. The premises shall have a written drug policy detailing measures taken to enforce

a zero tolerance towards drugs.

- 7. An incident log shall be kept on the premises to record any notable incidents, such as a report of crime and disorder, evidence or suspicion of drug related activity and any requests made for persons to leave the premises. The log should record the date and time, the nature of the incident and the person recording it, the outcome or action taken and a police log number if appropriate. Entries should be completed as soon as possible, and in all cases, no later than the close of business on the day of the incident. The written record shall be available for inspection by any responsible authority upon request.
- 8. All members of staff employed by the premises shall undertake vulnerabilities training at least once per annum, the training shall include but not limited to personal safety, drink safety and serving alcohol to those that are drunk.

### **ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION CONDITIONS**

- 1) All external doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is being provided after 23.00 hours, except in the event of an emergency.
- 2) All doors located in an area where regulated entertainment takes place which lead to any external areas shall be fitted with a self-closing device.
- 3) All doors located in an area where regulated entertainment takes place which lead to any external areas shall be lobbied.
- 4) No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises that gives rise to a nuisance to any nearby business or resident
- 5) The volume of all amplified sound used in connection with all entertainment provided shall at all times be under the control of the licensee or management and the controlling mechanism so installed shall be maintained and operated from a part of the premises inaccessible to the public.
- 6) While live or recorded music or other entertainment takes place, the licensee or management shall undertake regular monitoring of noise levels at the nearest noise-sensitive locations. A record shall be kept of any monitoring, including the date, time and location of monitoring; the name of the monitor; and any action taken. Records shall be kept for no less than six months and shall be made available upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of West Lancashire Borough Council.
- 7) Any outside bar areas shall cease in the supply of alcohol between the hours of 00.00 and 09.00 hours.
- 8) Any outside seating areas used for the consumption of alcohol shall be closed between the hours of 00.30 and 09.00 hours, inclusive of a 30 minute drinking

up period from 00.00 to 00.30.

- 9) No music or speech shall be relayed via external speakers (included those within mounted televisions or monitors) other than for events where the prior approval of the Licensing Authority has been obtained, save for the purposes of playing any incidental background music not at a level considered to cause nuisance to nearby residents.
- 10) Notices shall be displayed at public exits, in a clear and prominent position, requesting that patrons respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 11)The Designated Premises Supervisor and other members of staff to request customers to leave quietly and have respect for their residential neighbours.
- 12) No deliveries will take place between the hours of 21.00 and 08.00 hours.
- 13) The placing of refuse, such as bottles, into receptacles outside the premises shall take place between 08.00 and 21.00 hours only, so as to prevent disturbance to nearby premises.
- 14) The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that staff arriving early morning or departing late at night when the business has ceased trading conduct themselves in such a manner to avoid disturbance to nearby residents.
- 15) The Designated Premises Supervisor or nominated person shall regularly monitor levels of noise in any outside area used for smoking and advise customers of the need to respect local residents where appropriate. Any patrons continuing to cause any disturbance or disorder will be asked to leave the premises.
- 16) Half an hour before the premises is due to close, the volume and tempo of any regulated entertainment shall be reduced.

### **HEARING PROCEDURE**

- 1. The Chairman introduces the Members and the main Officers.
- 2. The Chairman invites the other parties to the hearing to introduce themselves.
- The Chairman refers to this procedure, which will be followed.
   (NB. The Chairman will explain that he will allow the parties to proceed without specific time constraints).
- 4. The Chairman asks the Director Leisure and Wellbeing (or their representative) to outline the application.

### 5. Applicant's case

- (a) The Applicant (or representative) will present their case. This will include general opening remarks followed by calling witnesses.
- (b) The other parties to the hearing may then ask questions of the Applicant and witnesses, commencing with each Responsible Authority (if present) and concluding with the Sub-Committee.

### 6. Relevant representations – Responsible Authorities (if present)

- (a) Each Responsible Authority (or representative) will present their case. This will include general opening remarks followed by calling witnesses.
- (b) The other parties to the hearing may then ask questions of each Responsible Authority and witnesses, commencing with the Applicant and concluding with the Sub-Committee.

### 7. Relevant Representations – Interested Parties (if present)

(c) Interested Parties will be asked by the Chairman if they wish to elect a spokesperson or representative (or speak individually). Interested Parties will present their case. This will include general opening remarks followed by calling witnesses.

- (d) The other parties to the hearing may then ask questions of the Interested Parties and witnesses, commencing with the Applicant and concluding with the Sub-Committee.
- 8. If several representations (objections) have been received, Interested Parties may question the Applicant and witnesses in turn in an order to be determined by the Chairman. The same order will follow when it comes to the Interested Parties being questioned.
- 9. The Chairman to ask all parties and the Sub-Committee if they have any further relevant questions or comments arising from the hearing.
- 10. Interested Parties, Responsible Authorities and the Applicant to make their closing address in that order (so that the Applicant has the final say).
- 9. The Chairman will ask the Legal Adviser whether there are any other matters to be raised or resolved before the hearing is closed for deliberations.
- 10. The Sub-Committee will retire to determine the application calling the Legal Advisor and Member Services Officer as needed.
- 11. When the Sub-Committee returns the Chairman will announce the decision and give reasons. All parties to the hearing will receive confirmation of the decision in writing within five working days.

End.

If any of the parties, representative or observers, wish to discuss any matters relating to the hearing, Officers will be available at the conclusion of the hearing.

### 4.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 4.1 The Premises Licence held in respect of Ormskirk Superstore, 16 Aughton Street, Ormskirk is attached as Appendix 1 to this report.
- 4.2 A location plan of the premises and the surrounding area is attached as Appendix 2 to this report.
- 4.3 Members will recall that on 5 January 2022 Lancashire County Council Trading Standards Service submitted an application for the Review of the Premises Licence in respect of Ormskirk Superstore, 16 Aughton Street, Ormskirk, L39 3BW. A Review Hearing was held on the 28 February 2022 and the decision is attached as Appendix 3 to this report.

### 5.0 THE APPLICATION FOR REVIEW

5.1 In accordance with the Act, on 8 November 2022 Lancashire Constabulary submitted an application for the Review of the Premises Licence in respect of Ormskirk Superstore, 16 Aughton Street, Ormskirk. The grounds for the Review as stated in the application are:

"This application for review is submitted by Lancashire Constabulary, since August 2022 Lancashire Constabulary have visited the premises several times with West Lancashire Borough Council Licensing and Lancashire Trading Standards. The findings on the visits have been multiple non-compliance of the premises licence conditions, instances of illicit tobacco being seized, a large metal "kebab skewer" being recovered from behind the till area, alcohol sales being made outside authorised hours and CCTV showed staff splitting a packet of cigarettes before putting a cigarette in the mouth of 3 persons who appear under the age of 18 and lighting one of them.

The licensing objectives of The Prevention of Crime & Disorder and Protection of Children From Harm are being undermined at the premises. "

- 5.2 A copy of the full application for review is attached as Appendix 4 to this report.
- 5.3 On 17 November 2022 Lancashire Constabulary submitted a 38-page report detailing their representation. This is attached as Appendix 5 to this report.
- 5.4 On 30 November 2022 following an unannounced inspection to Ormskirk Superstore on 26 November Lancashire Constabulary submitted further information in respect of the representation, this is attached as Appendix 6 to the report. Along with this information Lancashire Constabulary also submitted body cam footage and stills taken from the body cam footage from the 26 November 2022 unannounced inspection. The stills are attached as Appendix 7a, 7b and 7c to this report. The body cam footage will be shown at the hearing.
- 5.3 In accordance with Section 51(3) of the Act, the relevant Notices detailing the aforementioned grounds for Review were displayed on the premises thereof giving interested parties and responsible authorities, the right to make

representations regarding the application for Review. The notice was also published on the Council's website. The Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor have been forwarded copies of the application for Review.

### 6.0 RELEVANT REPRESENTATIONS

- 6.1 A representation has been received from Lancashire County Council Trading Standards Service. The representation has been made under the crime and disorder and protection of children from harm objectives. A copy of this representation is attached as Appendix 8 to this report. Further information was received from Lancashire County Council Trading Standards Service relating to a visit to the premises on 16 December 2022, this is attached as Appendix 9 to this report.
- 6.2 A representation has been received from a Ward Councillor on behalf of members of the public. The representation has been made under the crime and disorder and protection of children from harm objectives. A copy of this representation is attached as Appendix 10 to this report.

### 7.0 ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- 7.1 A Senior Licensing Officer visited the premises on 7 September 2022, at the time of inspection there were a number of licence conditions that were not being implemented. The details are attached to this report as Appendix 11.
- 7.2 The premises licence holder has submitted numerous emails, images and video footage to Officers that he may choose to present at the hearing. The licence holder has been contacted via email and telephone to ascertain which evidence he intends to refer to at the hearing however at the time of writing this report this clarification has not been received. This evidence has been compiled in the event the premises licence holder wishes to refer to it at the time of the hearing. The evidence consists of a series of emails, including photographs and 17 videos, between the premises licence holder and Officers between 13<sup>th</sup> December 2022 and 22th December 2022. This email communication has been attached as Appendix 12 and the individual emails, photographs and videos will be made available at the time of the hearing. For full details of this evidence, please contact the premises licence holder directly.
- 7.3 This hearing was deferred from the original date of 4th January 2023 as the premises licence holder requested a Kurdish Sorani translator to be present at the hearing. This has now been arranged by the Licensing Service.

### 8.0 LICENSING POLICY AND LEGAL CONSIDERATIONS

8.1 The Licensing Authority must have regard to the provisions of the Act. In addition, Section 4 of the Act provides that a Licensing Authority must have regard to its Statement of Licensing Policy and to the guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Act.

- 8.2 The Council's Licensing Policy provides that licence holders should be given sufficient warning of any concerns regarding problems, which have been identified at the premises, and the need to make improvements. Licensees are expected to respond to such warning and implement the necessary remedial action. The message is clear that any failure to respond to such warnings would more than likely lead to a request for review of the licence.
- 8.3 As Members will be aware, the four licensing objectives are as follows:
  - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
  - Public Safety
  - Prevention of Public Nuisance
  - The Protection of Children from Harm
- 8.4 The Act provides that before determining a review application, the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to consider it and relevant representations.
- 8.5 The Licensing Authority in determining a review application, having had regard to the application and any representations, may take the following steps if it considers it necessary for the promotion of the licensing objective:
  - (i) Modify the conditions of the licence
  - (ii) Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
  - (iii) Remove the Designates Premises Supervisor
  - (iv) Suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months
  - (v) Revoke the licence
- 8.6 In deciding which of the powers to use it is expected that the Licensing Authority should, as far as possible, seek to establish the causes of the concerns that the representations identify. Any action the Committee may wish to take should generally be directed at these causes and should always be no more than an appropriate response in the cause of promoting the licensing objectives.
- 8.7 In particular, Members' attention is drawn to the following sections of the Policy, which must be read in conjunction with this report:

### 9.0 HUMAN RIGHTS ACT IMPLICATIONS

9.1 The Human Rights Act 1988 makes it unlawful for a Local Authority to act in a way that is incompatible with the European Convention on Human Rights. The Council will have particular regard to the following convention rights;

### Article 6

that in the determination of civil rights and obligations everyone is entitled to a fair public hearing within a reasonable time by an independent and impartial tribunal established by law;

### Article 8

that everyone has the right to respect for his home and family life;

### **Article 1 of the First Protocol**

that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his/her possessions including for example, possession of a licence.

### 10.0 SUSTAINABILITY IMPLICATIONS

10.1 The Council's Licensing Policy (required under the Act), which underpins the Committee's decision, impacts upon many areas within the Community. The Committee must balance the Licensing Objectives contained in the Policy to ensure these impacts are suitably controlled.

### 11.0 FINANCIAL AND RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

11.1 No additional financial or other resources are required.

### **ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS**

The licence is granted subject to the Mandatory conditions for sale of alcohol as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 as amended by the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 and Order 2014.

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence
  - (a) At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or
  - (b) At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made, or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises.
    - a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the
      purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a
      significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
    - d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
    - e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
    - (a) a holographic mark or

- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

### Minimum Drinks Pricing

- A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
  - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
  - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula –

$$P = D + (DxV)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
  - (i) The holder of the premises licence
  - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
  - (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
    - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

### If the Premises Licence allows Exhibition of Films

- Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
- 2. Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation by that body.
- 3. Where

4.

(a) The film classification body is not specified in the licence, or

- (b) The relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.
- 4. In this section "children" means any person aged under 18; and "film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984(c39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

## If the Premises Licence has conditions in respect of Door Supervision except theatres, cinemas, bingo halls and casinos

- 1. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must:
  - (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001;
     or
  - (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Act.
- 2. But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed:
  - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or
  - (b) in respect of premises in relation to:
    - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
    - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act.
- 3. For the purposes of this section:
  - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and, which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act, (see Section 3(2) of that Act) and
  - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

The Mandatory Conditions on this licence are those that where in force at the time the Licence was printed, but that they are subject to amendment by Central Government. Current Mandatory Conditions can be viewed at <a href="https://www.gov.uk">www.gov.uk</a>.

The premises licence holder should be warned that it is a requirement that they must comply with the Mandatory Condition in force not merely the ones contained on the licence.

### ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

The premises shall install and maintain a digital CCTV system

The CCTV system shall have sufficient hard drive storage capacity to store a minimum of 31 days.

The CCTV system shall be capable of obtaining clear facial recognition images and a clear head and shoulders image of every person entering or leaving the premises at the entrance.

A CCTV log will be completed on a weekly basis to record all elements of the CCTV System is maintained in good working order and recordings date and time stamped.

Only nominated staff shall be trained in the operation of the CCTV system to ensure rapid data retrieval & downloads of footage can be provided to the Police & the Local Authority Officer upon reasonable request in accordance with the Data Protection Act.

CCTV shall be continually recording during licensable hours.

In the event of a failure of the CCTV system for any reason, a record of the failure will be recorded in the premises log and immediate steps will be made to rectify the problem.

Proxy signs will be sited on the premises to deter proxy sales on behalf of under 18's.

The DPS will provide training to staff in relation to alcohol sales and to authorise the employees the DPS considers competent to sell alcohol on their behalf in writing. A written sale of Alcohol register will be maintained at the premises.

An incident log must be kept at the premises. Log records will be retained for a period of 12 months from the date it occurred. It will be made immediately available on request to an authorised person' (as defined by section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), an authorised trading standards officer or the police, and must record the following;

- (a) All crimes reported to the premises (where relevant to the licensing objectives)
- (c) Any incidents of disorder

When the designated premises supervisor is not on duty, a contact telephone number will be available at all times.

All spirits will be stored and sold behind the counter.

Roller shutters have been installed at the front and a steel security door at the rear of the premises

Prominent, clear and legible signage shall be displayed at all exits to the premises requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quickly and quietly. (Quiet Notice).

All deliveries of good will be received at the rear of the premise.

All waste products will be stored in a suitable receptacle at the rear of the premise.

No exterior lights apart from the rear security light fixed to the premises, will cause annoyance to any residential property.

A written register of refusals will be kept including a description of the people who have been unable to provide required identification to prove their age. Such records shall be kept for a period of 12 months and will be collected by the designated premises supervisor and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by section 13 of the licensing act 2003) or an authorised trading standards officer the local authority/council on demand.

All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in Challenge 25. Training records shall be kept on the premises and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by section 13 of the licensing act 2003) or an authorised trading standards officer of the local authority/council on demand

The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 policy. Such policy shall be written down and kept at the premises. The policy shall be produced on demand by the police, an 'authorised person' (as defined by section 13 of the licensing act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer.

Prominent, clear and legible Challenge 25 signage shall also be displayed at all entrances to the premises as well as at, at least one location behind any counter advertising the scheme operated.

### ANNEX 3 - CONDITIONS ATTACHED AFTER A HEARING BY THE LICENSING AUTHORITY

Whenever licensable activities are taking place at least one member of staff present within the premises must hold a Personal Licence.

All staff, including the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) must undertake Challenge 25 refresher training at least every 6 months the details of which must be recorded in the training manual and disclosed to any Responsible Authority on reasonable request.

All persons (including the DPS) involved in the sale of licensable products shall undertake the Lancashire County Council Check 25 online training (whilst available).

A notice must be displayed on the Premises providing details of all persons authorised to sell alcohol including their name, address and up to date contact telephone number.

## APPLICATION FOR REVIEW OF THE PREMISES LICENCE IN RESPECT OF ORMSKIRK SUPERSTORE, 16 AUGHTON STREET ORMSKIRK L39 3BW

On the 28<sup>th</sup> February 2022 the Licensing Sub-Committee (Sub-Committee) considered an application for a Review of the Premises Licence submitted by Lancashire County Council Trading Standards (the Applicant) under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 (the Act). This application was in respect of Ormskirk Superstore, 16 Aughton Street, Ormskirk L39 3BW (the Premises).

The Applicant was represented by Mr Sam McConnell, Trading Standards Officer.

The Premises Licence Holder (PLH) and Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS), Mr Farhad SALEHI (the Respondent) represented himself.

Councillor Dowling, a local Ward Councillor who had submitted representation also addressed the panel. Lancashire Constabulary had previously submitted a representation in support of the application for Review.

Having fully considered the representations (written and oral), the Sub-Committee retired to reach its decision.

In reaching its decision the panel took into account the following:

- Both written and oral evidence presented in connection with the hearing
- Licensing Act 2003
- S182 Amended Guidance of the Licensing Act 2003 and taken into account the references to the guidance made by both parties (S182 Guidance)
- West Lancashire Borough Council's Licensing Policy 2020 (the Policy)

Consideration was also given to the report of the Corporate Director of Place and Community as contained on pages 43 to 70 of the Book of Reports.

### Evidence

When considering whether any of the four Licensing Objectives had been undermined, the Committee concluded that on the evidence presented the 'Prevention of Crime and Disorder' and 'Protection of Children from Harm objectives' may have been undermined.

### Crime and Disorder

### Grounds for Review

The Trading Standards Service has received a number of complaints in relation to underage sales and the supply of illicit tobacco from this shop. A packet of counterfeit Mayfair cigarettes was purchased by a 15 year old test purchaser on 9<sup>th</sup> August 2021, and 78 illicit tobacco products subsequently seized by Trading Standards on the same day.

Despite this enforcement visit, Trading Standards have continued to receive complaints alleging underage sales and the sale of illicit tobacco. A test purchase

of e-cigarettes was attempted on 22<sup>nd</sup> December 2021. The 14 year old test purchaser was sold 2 'Geek Bars' containing nicotine.

Therefore, the Licensing Committee is encouraged to consider revocation of the relevant premises licence for Ormskirk Superstore.

### A. Complaints

The Sub-Committee accepted that there had been numerous complaints from different complainants regarding concerns of illegal/underage sales of mainly tobacco/tobacco products but also alcohol since the Premises opened. It was noted that some of these complaints had been anonymous.

The Applicant stated that on the 29/03/21 the Applicant received a complaint from a member of the public regarding images and paraphernalia including bongs and grinders in the shop window. The Applicant subsequently visited the Premises on the 12/04/21 when advice was given, and the items were removed from display by the Respondent and/or his staff. The Applicant also provided advice regarding other issues such as the display of cigarettes, relevant signage, Challenge 25, training and refusal registers. The Sub-Committee accepted the Applicant had provided the Respondent with a pack of information to assist him with the operation of the business in the future.

The Sub-Committee noted that the Premises Licence was only granted on the 12/04/21 (the day of the initial visit) and as such the Respondent would not have been in possession of Premises Licence at the time of inspection so would have been unable to have it on display as required under the legislation. They therefore gave no weight to the evidence relating to this issue.

They noted that the Respondent had stated that he had not held a Premises Licence previously and although he had operated a Barbers Shop in the Southport area, he had not had prior experience of running a licensed premises.

The Sub-Committee noted that there had been two failed test purchases for the sale of tobacco or tobacco products on the 09/08/21 and 21/12/21 and a quantity of 78 tobacco products had been discovered which were believed by the Applicant to have been illicit. The Sub-Committee noted that investigations were ongoing and no formal criminal proceedings had been concluded. That said, they accepted that this did not stop them taking the issues into account.

They noted that the Respondent had not been present on the premises when either of the test purchases had taken place and at the time of the hearing no action was being proposed to be taken against the Respondent directly. Trading Standards had not yet decided whether to pursue a Prohibition Order to prevent the sale of tobacco/tobacco products from the Premises.

The Respondent advised the Sub-Committee that, after opening the Premises, his mother (who lives abroad) had become very ill and had had to have both her legs amputated. As such, he had had to go home to be with her on more than one occasion and had left other staff in charge of the premises. He confirmed that he was out of the country at the time of the second failed test purchase and on returning to the UK he had been required to self-isolate for two weeks, which had meant that he had spent more time away from the business than he would have liked.

He said that all members of staff had received training and he had reminded them of their responsibilities regarding sales to underage persons. He stated that he was initially unaware of the problems and was only presented with all the paperwork when he returned to the business. He stated that on finding out about the issues he had sacked all members of staff who had been involved. He stated that he was not aware that illegal cigarettes were being sold, that he had trained staff to deal with underage sales and felt that they had tried to take advantage of his situation and make extra money for themselves. He said that he now worked full time in the store and his cousin's girlfriend would be helping him in the future as he would not be able to work 7 days a week.

The Respondent apologised to the Committee for the incidents that happened at the Premises and said that he would ensure that it will never happened again. He would make sure that staff were properly trained and would continue to remind them of their responsibilities. The Respondent asked the Committee not to revoke his licence as he had worked hard to start the business and did not want to see it closed.

The Sub-Committee noted that at the time of the hearing the Respondent had provided evidence of staff training records, refusals register and an accident log. They felt that this indicated that the Respondent had acted on advice given by Trading Standards and other professional bodies. That said, the Sub-Committee did have some concerns about the validity of some of the entries in the registers as some of the records appeared to have been pre-populated and gave inconsistent/questionable information. For example, one entry referred to a refusal on the basis that the person did not look 30 years old when the Premises operated a Challenge 25 policy.

The Sub-Committee felt that, although the Respondent had complied with the conditions of the Premises Licence and followed advice from the Applicant, he must ensure that the various registers in respect of refusals, training and accidents are properly kept, and that staff are trained to ensure a true and accurate record is kept in each register.

The Sub-Committee considered the evidence provided by the Ward Councillor and noted his concerns regarding the two failed test purchases, complaints regarding the sale of tobacco to children (or any age restricted product) and the potential harm that could be caused if it was allowed to continue. The Sub-Committee noted the allegation regarding the potential intimidation of witnesses and their reluctance to provide direct evidence at the hearing, but noted that no evidence had been provided to substantiate the allegations of intimidation either against the Respondent directly or any of the other staff involved with the Premises.

The representation from Lancashire Constabulary stated that they did not have any incidents reported against the Premises and as such there was no evidence of intimidation or criminal/illegal behaviour. The Police had not objected to the grant of the Premise Licence or the Respondent's appointment as DPS less than a year previously. Their representation stated that the sale of products to underage persons did raise concerns and as such they supported the application for Review.

At the conclusion of the hearing the Applicant advised the Legal Advisor to the Sub-Committee that if the Sub-Committee were minded not to revoke the licence, then he would ask that conditions be attached to the licence to cover the following:

1. Refresher training every 6 months for the DPS and any staff.

- 2. That if the DPS is to be absent from the premises for a period of 1 week or more that he informs the Licensing Authority of the name address and telephone number of the person responsible for the premises in his absence.
- 3. That the DPS and all staff undertake the Lancashire County Council Check 25 online training. The Applicant stated that the training is monitored and would allow them to check that training was being undertaken in accordance with the proposed condition.

### B. Legislation/Policy/Guidance

The Sub-Committee considered all references to the Legislation, S182 Guidance and the Policy. They noted that their primary consideration was the promotion of the four Licensing Objectives. They gave particular weight to the following:

### S182 Guidance

### Licensing objectives and aims

- 1.2 The legislation provides a clear focus on the promotion of four statutory objectives which must be addressed when licensing functions are undertaken.
- 1.3 The licensing objectives are:
  - · The prevention of crime and disorder;
  - Public safety;
  - · The prevention of public nuisance; and
  - The protection of children from harm.
- 1.4 Each objective is of equal importance. There are no other statutory licensing objectives, so that the <u>promotion of the four objectives is a paramount consideration</u> at all times.

### Crime and disorder

2.1 <u>Licensing authorities should look to the police as the main source of advice on crime and disorder.</u> They should also seek to involve the local Community Safety Partnership (CSP).

### **Protection of Children from Harm**

### Offences relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to children

2.32 Licensing authorities are expected to maintain close contact with the police, young offenders' teams and trading standards officers (who can carry out test purchases under section 154 of the 2003 Act) about the extent of unlawful sales and consumption of alcohol by minors and to be involved in the development of any strategies to control or prevent these unlawful activities and to pursue prosecutions. Licensing authorities, alongside the police, are prosecuting authorities for the purposes of these offences, except for the offences under section 147A (persistently selling alcohol to children). Where, as a matter of policy, warnings are given to retailers prior to any decision to

prosecute in respect of an offence, it is important that each of the enforcement arms should be aware of the warnings each of them has given

- 11.16 Sub-Committee had a wide range of powers which it may exercise where it considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 11.19 The steps available to the Sub-Committee (in respect of an application for Review) when action is deemed necessary which include:
  - Do nothing
  - Modify the conditions on the premises licence which includes adding new conditions or any alteration or omission of an existing condition
  - Exclusion of a licensable activity
  - Removal of the DPS Suspend the Licence for a period not exceeding 3 months
  - Revoke the licence.
- 11.20 When deciding what action to take the licensing authority should seek to establish the cause or causes of the concerns that representations identify. The remedial action taken should generally be directed at these causes and should always be no more than an appropriate and proportionate response to address the causes of concern that instigated the review.
- 11.23 Licensing authorities should also note that modifications of conditions and exclusions of licensable activities may be imposed either permanently or for a temporary period of up to three months. Temporary changes or suspension of the licence for up to three months could impact on the business holding the licence financially and would only be expected to be pursued as an appropriate means of promoting the licensing objectives or preventing illegal working. So, for instance, a licence could be suspended for a weekend as a means of deterring the holder from allowing the problems that gave rise to the review to happen again. However, it will always be important that any detrimental financial impact that may result from a licensing authority's decision is appropriate and proportionate to the promotion of the licensing objectives and for the prevention of illegal working in licensed premises. But where premises are found to be trading irresponsibly, the licensing authority should not hesitate, where appropriate to do so, to take tough action to tackle the problems at the premises and, where other measures are deemed insufficient, to revoke the licence

### Reviews arising in connection with crime

- 11.24 A number of reviews may arise in connection with crime that is not directly connected with licensable activities. For example, reviews may arise because of drugs problems at the premises, money laundering by criminal gangs, the sale of contraband or stolen goods, the sale of firearms, or the sexual exploitation of children. Licensing authorities do not have the power to judge the criminality or otherwise of any issue. This is a matter for the courts. The licensing authority's role when determining such a review is not therefore to establish the guilt or innocence of any individual but to ensure the promotion of the crime prevention objective.
- 11.25 Reviews are part of the regulatory process introduced by the 2003 Act and they are not part of criminal law and procedure. There is, therefore, no reason why representations giving rise to a review of a premises licence need be delayed pending

the outcome of any criminal proceedings. Some reviews will arise after the conviction in the criminal courts of certain individuals, but not all. In any case, it is for the licensing authority to determine whether the problems associated with the alleged crimes are taking place on the premises and affecting the promotion of the licensing objectives. Where a review follows a conviction, it would also not be for the licensing authority to attempt to go beyond any finding by the courts, which should be treated as a matter of undisputed evidence before them.

- 11.26 Where the licensing authority is conducting a review on the grounds that the premises have been used for criminal purposes, its role is solely to determine what steps should be taken in connection with the premises licence, for the promotion of the crime prevention objective. It is important to recognise that certain criminal activity or associated problems may be taking place or have taken place despite the best efforts of the licence holder and the staff working at the premises and despite full compliance with the conditions attached to the licence. In such circumstances, the licensing authority is still empowered to take any appropriate steps to remedy the problems. The licensing authority's duty is to take steps with a view to the promotion of the licensing objectives and the prevention of illegal working in the interests of the wider community and not those of the individual licence holder
- 11.27 There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises which should be treated particularly seriously. These are the use of the licensed premises:
  - for the illegal purchase and consumption of alcohol by minors which impacts on the health, educational attainment, employment prospects and propensity for crime of young people;
  - for the sale or storage of smuggled tobacco and alcohol.

11.28 It is envisaged that licensing authorities, the police, the Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) and other law enforcement agencies, which are responsible authorities, will use the review procedures effectively to deter such activities and crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of the licence – even in the first instance – should be seriously considered

# The Policy

#### **Prevention of Crime and Disorder**

- 4.11 Whilst the Authority considers the Police to be the main source of advice on crime and disorder, it will also seek to involve the Community Safety Partnership (CSP) in its holistic approach to licensing. The duty of the Authority under Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 is in addition to its duty under Section 4 of the Act to promote the prevention of crime and disorder. The Authority is therefore committed to supporting its partnership work in the fight against crime and disorder in West Lancashire
- 4.15 The Authority will pay equal regard to relevant representations from Responsible Authorities, but will pay particular regard to relevant representations from the Police to

determine if the proposed measures are sufficient to reduce the risk of crime and disorder.

- 4.17 The issues in the following list, which is not exhaustive, are particularly relevant to the exercise of the Authority's licensing functions and ones which applicants and existing licensees need to consider:
  - The capability of the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) or any other person appointed to be in charge of the premises to ensure effective and responsible management of the premises;
  - Provision of sufficient numbers of staff and managerial support to run the premises effectively;
  - The training given to staff in crime prevention measures.

#### **Protection of Children from Harm**

Under age / proxy sales

4.40 Applicants and existing licensees must have satisfactory arrangements in place to prevent underage alcohol sales. The issues in the following list, which is not exhaustive, are particularly relevant to the exercise of the Authority's licensing functions and ones which applicants and existing licensees need to consider ...

# **Licensing Principle 1**

8.8 The Authority expects to see evidence of the effective and responsible management of the licensed premises, the effective instruction, training and supervision of staff and the adoption of best practice being specifically addressed within the Operating Schedule.

#### Reviews associated with crime

- 12.7 A review may arise in connection with crime that is not directly connected with Licensable Activities. In such cases, the Authority will not judge the criminality or otherwise of any issue. Its role is not to establish the guilt or innocence of any individual, but to ensure the promotion of the crime prevention objective. Reviews therefore need not be delayed pending any court action, but where such action has been taken, it will not be for the Authority to attempt to go beyond any finding by the courts, which will be treated as a matter of undisputed evidence. To this end, it will treat those criminal matters listed in the Guidance particularly seriously.
- 12.8 Conversely, it is important to recognise that certain criminal activity or associated problems may be taking place or have taken place despite the best efforts of the licence holder and the staff working at the premises and despite full compliance with the conditions attached to the licence. In such circumstances, the Authority still has the option to take any appropriate steps to remedy the problems.

### Persistent sales of alcohol to children

12.9 Where there are systems in place designed to prevent underage sales, the Authority will take a proportionate approach toward any identified breaches. However, where persistent sales of alcohol to children have occurred, and it is apparent that those managing the premises do not operate a responsible policy or have not exercised appropriate due diligence, the Authority would expect Responsible Authorities to consider taking steps to ensure that a review of the licence takes place. This is particularly the

case where there has been a prosecution for the offence under\_Section 147A or a Closure Notice has been given under section 169A of the Act. In determining the review, the Authority will consider revoking the licence if it considers this appropriate.

### C. Decision

The Sub-Committee concluded that the evidence of two failed test purchases for the sale of tobacco/tobacco related products and allegations of underage sale of alcohol indicated that Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Protection of Children from Harm objectives had been undermined.

The Sub-Committee went on to consider their options and whether anything could be put in place to redress the balance. They considered revocation and whether such a step was appropriate and proportionate.

The Sub-Committee noted that, although there had been two failed test purchases for the sale of tobacco/tobacco related products, there was no evidence to substantiate the allegations of underage sales of alcohol. The Police had no incidents of any kind reported against the Premises.

The Sub-Committee noted that the revocation of the Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003 would not prevent the Premises from selling tobacco which was the substantiated grounds for the review. The business would continue to operate but would merely be prevented from selling alcohol.

In addition, the Sub-Committee concluded that at this present time there was no evidence to substantiate that the Respondent was on the premises when the underage sales took place or that he was complicit in the illegal activity. They noted that the Respondent had had some family issues which had taken him away from the day to day running of the premises and accepted that he only became aware that that staff were not complying with the legislative requirements/training provided when he returned to the business and was presented with the paperwork. They believed he had acted appropriately by sacking all the staff involved in the illegal activity and ensuring that only trusted people be allowed to work within the Premises in the future.

The Sub-Committee accepted that it would be unreasonable to expect the Respondent to be on the Premises at all times licensable activities were taking place, but they would expect the Respondent to ensure that the conditions on the licence where adhered to and that proper provision was put in place to ensure that the licensing objectives were not undermined.

The Sub-Committee noted that the Applicant had other powers available to them including obtaining a Prohibition Order which would be more effective in preventing the illegal sale of tobacco/tobacco related products.

They therefore felt that the revocation of the licence would not address the unlawful sale of tobacco and would not be an appropriate and proportionate response to the issues.

The Sub-Committee felt that the evidence showed that there were other measures rather than revocation available to redress the balance, which in turn was a more appropriate and proportionate measure to stop the cause of the issues.

They considered the conditions on the current licence which they felt were robust, but the Respondent should ensure compliance even when he is not present at the Premises.

The Sub-Committee went onto consider the conditions proposed by the Applicant in the event that revocation was not deemed to be appropriate or proportionate.

The Sub-Committee concluded that further conditions would be required to redress the balance on the four licensing objectives. It was felt appropriate that the sale of age restricted products should be undertaken in the presence of someone with a Personal Licence to give additional reassurance that any sales will be undertaken in accordance with the legislation.

The Sub-Committee expected the Respondent to adhere to all the licensing conditions and ensure that all staff including the Respondent were regularly trained in respect of Challenge 25 and completed all registers/records correctly. They also felt that provision should be put in place to ensure that any of the Responsible Authorities (not just the Licensing Authority) could be made aware of who was responsible for the sale of alcohol and/or age restricted products in the absence of the Respondent.

If it subsequently transpired that there were further complaints/evidence of non-compliance, the Review process could be initiated again and/or consideration could be given to prosecution.

# **CONCLUSION**

On hearing evidence from the Respondent, the Applicant, the Ward Councillor and the Police and taking into account all the above, the Sub Committee decided to impose the following additional conditions to the Premises Licence:

#### **RESOLVED:**

- A. Whenever licensable activities are taking place at least one member of staff present within the premises must hold a Personal Licence.
- B. All staff, including the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) must undertake Challenge 25 refresher training at least every 6 months the details of which must be recorded in the training manual and disclosed to any Responsible Authority on reasonable request.
- C. All persons (including the DPS) involved in the sale of licensable products shall undertake the Lancashire County Council Check 25 online training (whilst available).
- D A notice must be displayed on the Premises providing details of all persons authorised to sell alcohol including their name, address and up to date contact telephone number.

Since August 2022 Lancashire Constabulary have visited the premises several times with West Lancashire Borough Council Licensing and Lancashire Trading Standards. The findings of the visits have been multiple non-compliance of the premises licence conditions, instances of illicit tobacco being seized, a large metal "kebab skewer" being recovered from behind the till area, alcohol sales being made outside authorised hours and CCTV showed staff splitting a packet of cigarettes before putting a cigarette in the mouth of 3 persons who appear under the age of 18 and lighting one of them.
The licensing objectives of The Prevention of Crime & Disorder and Protection of Children From Harm are being undermined at the premises.

Please provide as much information as possible to support the application (please read guidance note 2)

On 26th May 2022, officers from Merseyside Constabulary attended the premises and executed a search of the premises under Section 18 of the Police & Criminal Evidence Act 1984 following an arrest they made in Southport. Officers seized a quantity of tobacco products from the premises, which they suspected to be counterfeit under Section 19 of the Police & Criminal Evidence Act 1984 and enquiries are still on-going.

On 7th September 2022 at approximately 1000hrs, Lancashire Constabulary attended the premises with West Lancashire Borough Council Licensing Officer Michaela MURRAY and were joined a short time later by Lancashire Trading Standards

During the visit MURRAY noted numerous non-compliance of the premises licence conditions. Prior to Trading Standards arriving, the female member of staff kept leaving the shop floor and going into the rear storage area. PCSO 7364 GORNALL reviewed CCTV at the premises, and it showed a female member of staff exiting the rear of the premises, stacking boxes before another member of staff picked them up and removed them from the area, it was believed that these boxes were illicit tobacco as a black bin bag containing them had been recovered at the side of the bin by Lancashire Trading Standards.

On 12th September 2022 at approximately 1255hrs, Lancashire Constabulary Licensing Officer PC 6884 Stephen CONNOLLY attended the premises with West Lancashire Borough Council Licensing Officer Michaela MURRAY and carried out a further inspection. The findings of this inspection showed that there had been no attempts to improve the non-compliance noted by MURRAY the previous week. PC CONNOLLY noted that the CCTV was only recording for 6 days, and the time was approximately 12 hours incorrect, the refusals register had contained "pre-filled" entries for transactions which had not occurred yet, no personal licence holder on site, CCTV log had not been completed since May 2021, Incident log had not been completed since April 2021 and the lone staff member was unable to provide any training records. PC CONNOLLY described the staff member as dismissive due to tutting and sighing when being asked for records. Due to the issues highlighted PC CONNOLLY served the premises with a Closure Notice under Section 19 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001.

On 13th September 2022, PC CONNOLLY wrote to Farhad SALEHI, the Designated Premises Supervisor and Licence Holder detailing his findings and actions. The letter was sent to the premises & registered home address for SALEHI as well as email. PC CONNOLLY also made a formal request under the Data Protection Act 2018 for a copy of the CCTV for the inspection

On 23rd September at approximately 1930hrs, Lancashire Constabulary Licensing Officer PC 6884 Stephen CONNOLLY attended the premises with West Lancashire Borough Council Licensing Officer Michaela MURRAY and representatives from Lancashire Trading Standards and undertook an inspection of the premises. PC CONNOLLY noted that there was no personal licence holder present, and no attempts had been made to rectify the non-compliance of the premises licence conditions. Removed from the premises was a large pointed metallic object which had been concealed behind the till, staff present claimed that they used it to tidy up the canned drink display. Lancashire Trading Standards recovered a quantity of illicit tobacco and non-compliant e-cigarettes. Upon reviewing the CCTV, PC CONNOLLY noted that the system had recorded on the hard drive 12 days of footage which would suggest that the system had been deliberately tampered with to erase footage when he attended on the 12th September 2022. The CCTV also showed that on the

Wednesday 21st & Thursday 22nd September 2022 that transactions for alcohol sales had been made beyond 2300hrs which the premises is licensed until. PC CONNOLLY also raised his concerns over footage which showed a member of staff splitting a package of cigarettes and putting an individual cigarette into the mouths of 3 males that appeared no older than 16 years, the staff member then went on to light one of the cigarettes for the males.

On 21st October 2022 at approximately 12:10hrs, Lancashire Constabulary Licensing Officer PC 6884 Stephen CONNOLLY attended the premises. PC CONNOLLY noted that the DPS was present and had claimed that he had been out of the country due to a family bereavement but wasn't able to say exactly when he returned to the UK. The DPS advised that he was aware of the issues raised at the premises whilst he was away but was too busy to have addressed them other than some entries in the refusals log. CCTV was reviewed and determined that the system is only recording for 14 days before reaching capacity and the time stamp had not changed. The sales register was also reviewed and showed sales beyond authorised hours on 1st October 2022, 8th October 2022, 13th October 2022, 16th October 2022 and 19th October 2022. The transaction on the 1st October clearly displayed Captain Morgans Rum at 23:48hrs, when the premises is only licensed until 2330hrs. The DPS just kept blaming the staff and was somewhat dismissive about his responsibilities.

There are clear issues with Ormskirk Superstores and its staff, they hold little to no regard towards their obligations under the Licensing Act 2003 and will likely continue to operate in this manner.

Lancashire Constabulary would respectfully request the Licensing Sub-Committee to consider revocation of the premises licence as part of this review. Whilst this is the most severe of action that can be taken as part of a premises licence review, the rational for this is that removal of the DPS would achieve very little as he is also the premises licence holder and therefore in overall control of the premises. Imposing of further conditions would achieve very little as there have been numerous non-compliance of the current conditions with some going back as far as April 2021 and the DPS has advised he has been too busy to correct recent ones. A temporary suspension of the Premises Licence would only achieve a short-term relief, as already exhibited staff have been made aware of unauthorised alcohol sales, but continued to make similar transactions.

To support the revocation, the statutory guidance under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states

11.27: There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises which should be treated particularly seriously. These are the use of the licensed premises:

for the sale or storage of smuggled tobacco and alcohol.

Lancashire Trading Standards are a responsible authority and will be making representations as part of this application with regard to illicit Tobacco seized from the premises.

The premises shall install and maintain a digital CCTV system

The CCTV system shall have sufficient hard drive storage capacity to store a minimum of 31 days.

The CCTV system shall be capable of obtaining clear facial recognition images and a clear head and shoulders image of every person entering or leaving the premises at the entrance.

A CCTV log will be completed on a weekly basis to record all elements of the CCTV

System is maintained in good working order and recordings date and time stamped.

Only nominated staff shall be trained in the operation of the CCTV system to ensure rapid data retrieval & downloads of footage can be provided to the Police & the Local Authority Officer upon reasonable request in accordance with the Data Protection Act.

CCTV shall be continually recording during licensable hours.

In the event of a failure of the CCTV system for any reason, a record of the failure will be recorded in the premises log and immediate steps will be made to rectify the problem.

Proxy signs will be sited on the premises to deter proxy sales on behalf of under 18's. The DPS will provide training to staff in relation to alcohol sales and to authorise the employees the DPS considers competent to sell alcohol on their behalf in writing. A written sale of Alcohol register will be maintained at the premises.

An incident log must be kept at the premises. Log records will be retained for a period of 12 months from the

date it occurred. It will be made immediately available on request to an authorised person' (as defined by section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), an authorised trading standards officer or the police, and must record the following: -

- (a) All crimes reported to the premises (where relevant to the licensing objectives)
- (c) Any incidents of disorder

When the designated premises supervisor is not on duty, a contact telephone number will be available at all times.

All spirits will be stored and sold behind the counter.

Roller shutters have been installed at the front and a steel security door at the rear of the premises

Prominent, clear and legible signage shall be displayed at all exits to the premises requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quickly and quietly. (Quiet Notice).

All deliveries of good will be received at the rear of the premise.

All waste products will be stored in a suitable receptacle at the rear of the premise.

No exterior lights apart from the rear security light fixed to the premises, will cause annoyance to any residential property.

A written register of refusals will be kept including a description of the people who have been unable to provide required identification to prove their age. Such records shall be kept for a period of 12 months and will be collected by the designated premises supervisor and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by section 13 of the licensing act 2003) or an authorised trading standards officer the local authority/council on demand.

All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in Challenge 25. Training records shall be kept on the premises and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by section 13 of the licensing act 2003) or an authorised trading standards officer of the local authority/council on demand

The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 policy. Such policy shall be written down and kept at the premises. The policy shall be produced on demand by the police, an 'authorised person' (as defined by section 13 of the licensing act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer.

Prominent, clear, and legible Challenge 25 signage shall also be displayed at all entrances to the premises as well as at, at least one location behind any counter advertising the scheme operated.

Following a hearing by the licensing authority the following conditions were imposed on the Premises Licence

Whenever licensable activities are taking place at least one member of staff present within the premises must hold a

Personal Licence.

All staff, including the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) must undertake Challenge 25 refresher training at least every

6 months the details of which must be recorded in the training manual and disclosed to any Responsible Authority on

reasonable request.

A notice must be displayed on the Premises providing details of all persons authorised to sell alcohol including their name,

address and up to date contact telephone number

I am PC 6884 Stephen Connolly of Lancashire Constabulary, currently attached to the South Lancashire Constabulary Licensing Team based at Preston Police Station.

I make this statement in relation to an application submitted to West Lancashire Borough Council under Section 51 of The Licensing Act 2003 requesting a review of the Premises Licence LC9924 – Ormskirk Superstore Ltd, 16 Aughton Street, Ormskirk. L39 3BW

I submitted this application on behalf of Lancashire Constabulary due to concerns over the premises upholding the Licensing Objectives of Crime & Disorder and the Protection of Children from Harm.

The person relevant to this premises is Mr Farhad SALEHI who is both the Premises Licence Holder and the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS). SALEHI holds the Personal Licence 37786 which was issued by Sefton Council.

Ormskirk Superstore is a small retail outlet situated within Ormskirk Town Centre, it sells a variety of food and non-food goods however there is a considerable focus on alcohol sales. Ormskirk Superstore first applied for a premises licence in March 2021, during the application stages they used Late Temporary Event Notices and standard Temporary Event Notices to provide authority to sell alcohol.

On 29<sup>th</sup> March 2021, prior to his retirement PS 777 Horton had contact with SALEHI following complaints of the premises display heavy cannabis imagery. PS Horton advised that he felt the display presented as a 'Head Shop', a name given to premises that sold "legal highs" and drug paraphernalia prior to the implementation of the Psychoactive substances act 2016. PS Horton went on to state that failure to remove the display would prompt him to object to the Premises Licence application on the ground of Crime & Disorder.

On 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2021, Lancashire Constabulary received a report from a concerned member of the public stating that the premises had been selling alcohol and e-cigarettes to underage kids throughout the summer months.

On 5<sup>th</sup> January 2022, Lancashire Constabulary received notification from West Lancashire Borough Council that a Premises Licence review application had been received.

On 6<sup>th</sup> January 2022, I attended the premises in company with Michaela MURRAY from West Lancashire Borough Council Licensing where the review notices were erected.

On 21<sup>st</sup> January 2022, Lancashire Constabulary received an email from a West Lancashire Borough Councillor that they had been advised by another Councillor that they had seen a female in school uniform buying vape products at the premises.

On 10<sup>th</sup> February 2022, Lancashire Constabulary received a report from a male claiming to have been kept against his will inside the premises after staff accused him of stealing from the shop. During the report the male is released from the premises and advises that he no longer wanted to see police about this.

On 10<sup>th</sup> August 2021, Lancashire Constabulary received notification from Lancashire Trading Standards notified us of a failed test purchase for tobacco at the premises along with seizure of a quantity of counterfeit tobacco.

On 20<sup>th</sup> May 2022, Lancashire Constabulary received an allegation that an autistic 17-year-old male had been inside the premises when two Asian males that work at the premises dragged him into the back around, accused him of stealing from them several months previously and beat the male with their fists causing injury to his face. This was recorded as Actual Bodily Harm (ABH) and the investigation was closed at the request of the victim.

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On 26<sup>th</sup> May 2022, Officers from Merseyside Constabulary attended the premises following the arrest of a male linked to the premises on suspicion of possessing counterfeit tobacco, this was after a vehicle was stopped in Southport and the occupants were found in possession of large quantities of tobacco which was believed counterfeit and a large quantity of cash. The premises was searched by these officers under Section 18 of The Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984. I am told that items were seized as part of this search.

On 9<sup>th</sup> August 2022 PC 5734 ROWE, a Neighbourhood Policing Constable for the West Lancashire borough attended the premises along with Lancashire Trading Standards during the visit a large quantity of illicit tobacco and e-cigs were seized from the premises

On 7<sup>th</sup> September 2022 Police Community Support Officers 7364 GORNALL & 7750 MORLEY attended the premises in company with Michaela MURRAY and Lancashire Trading Standards for a joint inspection, PCSO GORNALL and MURRAY arrived at the premises before Lancashire Trading Standards. PCSO GORNALL advised that there was a lone female worker who disappeared into the rear of the premises upon their arrival. Upon Lancashire Trading Standards joining them the rear of the property was checked and a bag of illicit tobacco was located. PCSO GORNALL went on to say that MURRAY had confirmed that the female was the only member of staff present and did not hold a personal licence and that shortly after this a male called Star BAIZ entered the premises and became quite agitated and belligerent with those present before becoming obstructive when asked to show the CCTV. Upon entering the CCTV room PCSO MORLEY located the pincode for the CCTV system written down next to the hard drive and used it to access the system, noting that the system was running 11hours and 48 minutes fast. The footage when reviewed showed the female stack boxes at the rear and BAIZ walking away with them. Later that day MURRAY advised me that she had noted several non-compliance of the Premises Licence conditions and that she had left a disc and requested the staff provide a copy of the CCTV by tomorrow.

On 12<sup>th</sup> September 2022 I attended the premises with MURRAY following PCSO's GORNALL & MORLEY being given a blank disc when they went to collect CCTV. Given the issues previously recorded by MURRAY I undertook a further inspection and noted that there were no personal licence holders present, the CCTV was approximately 12 hours slow, the code to access the system was next the hard drive still the CCTV system was only returning footage from 7<sup>th</sup> September.

During my inspection I reviewed the CCTV logbook, this showed that there was no logbook entries 30<sup>th</sup> May 2021, the refusals logbook had prefilled entries despite transactions having not happened, nothing recorded in the incident logbook since April 2021, the lone staff member didn't hold a personal licence. When asked about training the staff member said she had been trained on the 1<sup>st</sup> August 2022, she claimed that she had been trained for underage sales, but it wasn't recorded anywhere. MURRAY advised that the training was minimal when she saw the records a week before. Given the non-compliance of the Premises Licence conditions I decided to issue the premises with a Closure Notice under Section 19 of The Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001.

Following this visit I wrote to the Licence holder, posting letters to both his registered home address and to the premises along with an email he provided to us during his initial application. The letter also contained a DP1, a formal request by Lancashire Constabulary to the Licence Holder requesting CCTV to be made available under the Data Protection Act 2022. At the time of submitting the review application, no persons from Ormskirk Superstores Ltd made CCTV available following this request.

On 13<sup>th</sup> September 2022, PC 1840 Megan BOON, Neighbourhood Policing Constable for West Lancashire borough emailed me advising that she had been passed the premises since PC ROWE attended in August and saw what she thought were non-compliant e-cigarettes on display in the premises. PC BOON also noted that there are always a large number of teenagers that loiter around the premises & down the side alley.

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On 14<sup>th</sup> September 2022, PC 5734 ROWE emailed me advising that on 20<sup>th</sup> August 2022 she had seen the premises open until approximately 00:00hrs. She remembered the date as it was the evening of a high-profile boxing event.

On 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2022, I attended the premises once again in company with MURRAY and Lancashire Trading Standards. I spoke with Star BAIZ who advised that the DPS was on holiday and that he was back next week, having been away for approximately 2 weeks. When asked how often the DPS was on site he advised that he visited every month or every 2 to 3 weeks. BAIZ confirmed that neither himself or the other staff member had a personal licence. I then asked BAIZ who was in charge with the DPS being absence who replied that "SOME GUYS COME BY" BAIZ then confirmed that he was the owner of the business. BAIZ claimed to have spoken with the DPS approximately 10 days ago. I was then passed a large, pointed metallic object by Lancashire Trading Standards which had been located behind the till. Staff claimed that it was an old kebab skewer that they used to tidy up the drinks display. I advised BAIZ that given the appearance of the object that it was used as a deterrent to any problematic customers. I advised BAIZ that I was seizing the object as I believed that continued possession may constitute an offence of possession of a pointed/bladed article in a public place. I had to raise my voice at BAIZ because he began arguing with me and interrupting me. BAIZ then began arguing with Lancashire Trading Standards when they located illicit or non-compliant tobacco products, I advised him that the more he argued the longer this process would take.

I then conducted and inspection of the CCTV. I determined that it was still showing approximately 12 and 15 minutes slow. I noted on my previous visit that the CCTV had only been recording for 5 days, my assumption was that the hard drive capacity was insufficient to record for 31 days and that it had automatically erased footage older than 5 days. It transpired that this was not the case and during this inspection the hard drive had 12 days' worth of footage available, leading me to the suspicion that the footage had been tampered with. Following on from the information from PC ROWE, I checked the recorded footage to determine what time the premises was open until. During this examination I noted that on 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2022 at approximately 2100hrs a group of teenage boys, which I estimated to be no older than 16 entered the premises and are served by BAIZ, who appears to split a packet of cigarettes and handing single cigarettes to the teens, more concerning BAIZ then lights a cigarette for one of the males. In my professional opinion, if the premises was running a check 25 policy as required by the Premises Licence, then each of these males would have been asked for identification, the CCTV showed no such challenge taking place.

Further examination of the CCTV showed a questionable transaction taking place at approximately 23:49hrs on 17<sup>th</sup> September 2022. BAIZ, is shown to come from the stock room with an unknown object in an opaque plastic bag. Three teenage males are then sold the item before leaving. On 16<sup>th</sup> September 2022 footage showed customers still inside the premises at approximately 23:56hrs and appeared to be browsing the alcohol displays but no transaction was seen to be made.

I then requested BAIZ to allow me access to their till which is a computer-based program which records date and time along with other transaction information electronically. I asked BAIZ if all the transactions went through the till, and he advised that sometimes it does but other times it was cash transactions.

As I examined the transactions, I noted that on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> September 2022 at approximately 00:15hrs the till had recorded a transaction for the sale of Tequila Rose. This was 45 mins after the authorised alcohol sales times.

During my inspection, I also noted a split bag of 'party balloons' behind the till area. Whilst in the back-office area, my letter sent to the DPS on 13<sup>th</sup> September 2022 had been opened

On 4<sup>th</sup> October 2022, PC BOON emailed me to advise that during freshers they saw a male inside the shop and observed the staff member go into the back storage area before coming out with a 'medium sized' Nitrous Oxide cannister to a male in his 20's.

PC BOON advised me that she wasn't 100% sure on the legality of this transaction, so she thought it would be best to make me aware. Whilst the sale of Nitrous Oxide is not illegal, it is classed as a psychoactive substance under the 2016 legislation and the sale for human consumption is a criminal offence. Whilst it is not possible to determine what intention the male had for the substance, open packets of balloons had been located on the previous visit, balloons are often coupled with Nitrous Oxide sales as a means to facilitate human consumption.

On 21<sup>st</sup> October 2022 I reattended the premises and spoke with the DPS, he claimed to have been out of the country for a bereavement and not on holiday like staff previously stated. The DPS was unable however to say what date he returned to the UK. He confirmed to me that he was aware of the issues raised during his absence other than a couple entries in the refusals register had made no further improvements towards his compliance, he claimed that he was "TOO BUSY"

Following reviewing till receipts, I noted that the time and date were correct with the actual time.

I discovered the following transactions: -

On Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> October 2022 at 23:48hrs a sale was made for Captain Morgans – the licence only authorized the sale of alcohol until 2330hrs.

On Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> October 2022 at 2309hrs a sale was made for 4 x 500ml San Miguel – the licence only authorizes the sale of alcohol until 2300hrs.

There were multiple other sales between 8<sup>th</sup> October and 15<sup>th</sup> October 2022 beyond the licensable hours, these were however not identified directly as alcohol and the receipts listed the items as nothing more than 'goods'

The DPS continued making excuse after excuse, blaming his staff, and generally just having no acceptance of his role & responsibilities as DPS and Licence Holder.

Ormskirk Superstores Ltd have held a licence for just short of 2 years. In this time, they have continually ignored their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003, they have shown complete disregard toward the law and have ignored any and all guidance given to them by the authorities.

I respectfully request that the Sub-Committee revoke the premises licence as part of this review.

ENTERED THE STORE, WHICH ONLY HAD ONE FEMALE STAFF MEMBER PRESENT. UPON OUR ENTRANCE THIS FEMALE STAFF MEMBER IMMEDIATELY DISAPPEARED INTO THE REAR OFFICE. I OBSERVED THAT SEVERAL TIMES IN THE COURSE OF OUR INTERACTIONS THE FEMALE STAFF MEMBER DISAPPEARED INTO THE REAR OFFICE. THE FEMALE STAFF MEMBER STATED THAT MR BAIZ HAD BEEN AT THE STORE EARLIER BUT WAS NO LONGER PRESENT. I ASSISTED WITH A SEARCH OF THE REAR OFFICE AND THE YARD TO THE REAR OF THE PROPERTY. DURING THIS SEARCH LAUREN MANNING FOUND A BLACK BIN BAG BY THE SIDE OF A BIN CONTAINING ILLEGAL TOBACCO PRODUCTS THAT WAS THEN SEIZED BY TRADING STANDARDS. WHILE I WAS PRESENT, MICHAELA MURRAY NOTED THAT THERE WAS NO STAFF MEMBER AT THE STORE PRESENT WITH A PERSONAL LICENCE TO SELL ALCOHOL.

A DARK-SKINNED MALE WHO I NOW KNOW TO BE STAR KHALID BAIZ ENTERED THE PREMISES AND BECAME QUITE AGITATED AND BELLIGERENT WITH THE LICENSING OFFICER AND TRADING STANDARDS. MR BAIZ THEN BECAME OBSTRUCTIVE WHEN ASKED TO SHOW THE STORE CCTV, REFUSING TO ASSIST WITH VIEWING IT.

MY COLLEAGUE PCSO MORLEY LOCATED THE PASSCODE FOR THE CCTV VIEWING SYSTEM, AND UPON VIEWING THE CCTV IT CLEARLY SHOWED THAT UPON MY ARRIVAL AT 1005 HOURS, THE FEMALE STAFF MEMBER BEGAN TO STACK BOXES OUTSIDE THE BACK DOOR FOR MR BAIZ TO PICK UP AND WALK AWAY WITH. I DID A TIME CHECK ON THE CCTV AT 1138 HOURS ON 07/06/2022 AND FOUND IT TO BE SHOWING A TIME OF 23:22 ON 06/09/2022. I LEFT THE STORE AT 1150 HOURS.

Mr Salehi,

I attended your store yesterday as a follow up visit to an inspection which was undertaken last week on 7<sup>th</sup> September by several authorities. It is my understanding that during this inspection there were numerous issues identified with your premises failing to comply with its premises licence conditions.

My inspection yesterday found that no attempts had been made to rectify these issues and I have recorded the following: -

- CCTV time is nearly 12 hours fast
- · CCTV is only retained on the hard drive for 6 days
- Refusal's register had been prefilled in with numerous mention on "No ID" with one entry even stating a time. This undermines any records within this register and suggests dishonesty is taking place with record keeping
- No entries in the CCTV logbook since May 2021
- No entries in the incident logbook since April 2021
- No persons on site held a personal licence
- Staff member was unable to provide me with any training records and acted like my presence was an inconvenience to her.
- Staff member present was unable to operate the CCTV and there was a 'post-it note' with the access code next to the hard drive.

I wish to now draw your attention to the following licence conditions from the premises licence: -

- The premises shall install and maintain a digital CCTV system
- The CCTV system shall have sufficient hard drive storage capacity to store a minimum of 31 days.
- A CCTV log will be completed on a weekly basis to record all elements of the CCTV System is maintained in good working order and recordings date and time stamped.
- Only nominated staff shall be trained in the operation of the CCTV system to ensure rapid data retrieval & downloads of footage can be provided to the Police & the Local Authority Officer upon reasonable request in accordance with the Data Protection Act.
- CCTV shall be continually recording during licensable hours. In the event of a failure of the CCTV system for any reason, a record of the failure will be recorded in the premises log and immediate steps will be made to rectify the problem.
- The DPS will provide training to staff in relation to alcohol sales and to authorise the employees the DPS considers competent to sell alcohol on their behalf in writing. A written sale of Alcohol register will be maintained at the premises
- An incident log must be kept at the premises. Log records will be retained for a period of 12 months
  from the date it occurred. It will be made immediately available on request to an authorised person'
  (as defined by section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), an authorised trading standards officer or the
  police, and must record the following.

- (a) All crimes reported to the premises (where relevant to the licensing objectives)
- (b) Any incidents of disorder
- A written register of refusals will be kept including a description of the people who have been unable
  to provide required identification to prove their age. Such records shall be kept for a period of 12
  months and will be collected by the designated premises supervisor and produced to the police or an
  'authorised person' (as defined by section 13 of the licensing act 2003) or an authorised trading
  standards officer the local authority/council on demand.
- All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in Challenge 25. Training records shall be kept on the premises and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by section 13 of the licensing act 2003) or an authorised trading standards officer of the local authority/council on demand
- The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 policy. Such policy shall be written down and kept at the
  premises. The policy shall be produced on demand by the police, an 'authorised person' (as defined
  by section 13 of the licensing act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer.
- All staff, including the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) must undertake Challenge 25 refresher training at least every 6 months the details of which must be recorded in the training manual and disclosed to any Responsible Authority on reasonable request.
- Whenever licensable activities are taking place at least one member of staff present within the premises must hold a Personal Licence.

Your premises was deemed to be lacking to adhere to these conditions and immediate improvement is required.

Due to the two recent inspections and failure to comply with your premises licence conditions I decided to issue the premises with a closure notice made under section 19 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001.

I now wish to draw your attention to section 20 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 – this section states that Lancashire Constabulary can apply to a justice of the peace at a Magistrates' Court for a closure order if the continued non-compliance of the premises licence conditions continues.

This closure notice can and will be used as evidence towards any applications regarding yourself or your premises in the future.

I have also included in a separate document a formal request under the Data Protection Act 2018 for CCTV of the inspection dated 7<sup>th</sup> September 2022. Failure to provide Lancashire Constabulary with this footage will be deemed a breach of your premises licence.

#### **GUIDANCE NOTES**

This applies where personal data is disclosed by an organisation subject to the GDPR to the police for the purposes of the prevention or detection of crime or the apprehension or prosecution of offenders.

It restricts the application of the GDPR data protection principles and subject rights (as listed in the Data Protection Act 2018 at Schedule 2 Part 1 Paragraph 1) to the extent that the application of those provisions would be likely to prejudice the prevention or detection of crime or the apprehension or prosecution of offenders.

In effect the exemption means that an organisation can provide personal data to the police where necessary for the prevention or detection of crime or the apprehension or prosecution of offenders without fear of breaching the GDPR or Data Protection Act 2018.

**Vital Interests** – GDPR Article 6(1)(d) provides a lawful basis for organisations to disclose personal data to the police where the disclosure *is necessary in order to protect the vital interests of the data subject or of another natural person.*





#### Photo below shows 2 x sales after licensable hours







Further to my previous statement.

On 26<sup>th</sup> November 2022 at approximately 22:52hrs I attended Ormskirk Superstores for an unannounced inspection of the premises. The DPS was present and upon reviewing the CCTV noted that the footage was retained from 4<sup>th</sup> November 2022, the DPS advised that there was a new hard drive fitted on this day. I also noted that the CCTV was running 56 minutes fast.

Upon reviewing the CCTV footage I noted that there were times where the DPS was not present, I asked if those working at the premises had a personal licence which he advised that he had trained the other staff members to have a personal licence, I advised him that he could not train someone to have a personal licence and that they needed to attend a course, pass and apply to their local authority for a personal licence. The DPS then claimed that Star BAIZ had obtained a personal licence but was unable to provide me with any details of it.

I advised that it was a licence condition that a personal licence holder had to be on site whilst licensable activity was being undertaken. The DPS replied that he was always there but would sometimes leave but come back. I advised the DPS that this was not sufficient and reminded him that the condition was imposed following the previous review.

I asked the DPS to email me with the details of any staff members with personal licences as when previously asked they all confirmed they didn't have one. The DPS agreed to send an email by 28<sup>th</sup> November with the details. At the time of writing (1730hrs 30/11/22) no email has been received from the DPS. A search of the Public Licensing Register at 1720hrs on 30/11/22 for Sefton Council, the authority where BAIZ lives proved negative for a personal licence in his name.

During my inspection I also reviewed the CCTV log, since my previous visit this had been updated however had not been completed since November 3<sup>rd</sup> 2022, the licence states that it must be completed weekly.

The incident log had seen a couple of basic entries and there had been several completed entries in the refusals register, however it was the same register which had pre-completed "no ID" entries. The training records that were presented to me were very poor and out of date. An examination of the till receipts showed that there had been no out of hours transactions over the last few days.

The DPS continues running his premises whilst not complying with the premises licence, despite undergoing another review of the premises licence.




Image shows sale of Captain








# THE LICENSING ACT 2003 - REPRESENTATION FROM RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITY

#### LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL TRADING STANDARDS SERVICE

I am Lauren Manning, Senior Trading Standards Officer, employed by Lancashire County Council Trading Standards Service.

I have delegated authority to exercise the County Council's powers and duties under relevant Trading Standards related Acts of Parliament and in this capacity to provide written and oral representations on behalf of the Lancashire County Council Head of Service for Trading Standards.

I make this statement using facts and matters within my own knowledge. Any facts and matters that are not within my own knowledge are true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

Lancashire County Council Trading Standards Service wishes to make representations in support of the application from Lancashire Constabulary to review the premises licence at Ormskirk Superstore, 16 Aughton Street, Ormskirk L39 3BW. The licence holder and designated premises supervisor at the premises is Mr Farhad Salehi.

Trading Standards applied for a review of the premises licence for Ormskirk Superstore on 5<sup>th</sup> January 2022, following an illicit tobacco seizure and underage sales of cigarettes and e-cigarettes at the premises. Four additional licence conditions were added by the Committee at the hearing on 28<sup>th</sup> February 2022, including a requirement for all persons (including the DPS) involved in the sale of licensable products to undertake the Lancashire County Council Check 25 online training. I have checked our records from 1<sup>st</sup> March 2022 to 5<sup>th</sup> December 2022 and can confirm that Mr Farhad Salehi has not completed the online Check 25 training. No other members of staff at the shop have completed the training.

I have checked our Trading Standards databases for information relating to the premises since the review on 28<sup>th</sup> February 2022 and can confirm the following:

**20**<sup>th</sup> **April 2022** – test purchase attempt for alcohol and e-cigarettes using two 16 year old volunteers. Sale refused.

**23<sup>rd</sup> June 2022** – Trading Standards were notified of a Police operation involving Mr Farhad Salehi on 26<sup>th</sup> May 2022. Officers from Merseyside Police stopped Mr Salehi in his vehicle in Southport. Officers searched the vehicle and seized numerous packs of illicit tobacco and cigarettes, as well as approximately £10,000 in cash. Mr Salehi was arrested.

His home address in Southport was searched and numerous illicit tobacco products were seized. A large number of the cigarettes and tobacco have been confirmed to be counterfeit.

Mr Salehi answered 'no comment' to all questions when interviewed by Police.

**30**<sup>th</sup> **June 2022** – complaint received from a member of the public alleging that the shop is selling e-cigarettes to underage children.

9<sup>th</sup> August 2022 – Inspection of premises carried out. Staff member present: Ms Raimonda Geruliene. 208 packs of illicit tobacco products were discovered and seized. 3 of the packs were found open in the till, 2 packs were found on the shelf with alcohol, 24 packs were in a plastic bag behind the counter. The rest were found in the store room.

555 non compliant e-cigarettes were also seized which were on open display. The law prohibits the sale of e-cigarettes with a capacity greater than 2ml, the products must possess a UK name and address for traceability, and important safety warnings must be present.

7<sup>th</sup> September 2022 – The premises were visited by Michaela Murray from West Lancashire Borough Council Licensing Department and Lancashire Police. A short time later I arrived at the premises with a colleague. Upon arrival I was informed by one of the officers from Lancashire Police that the member of staff, Raimonda Geruliene, had disappeared several times into the store room at the back of the shop for a long period of time when officers first arrived. PCSO Gornall and I then reviewed the CCTV footage at the premises, which showed Ms Geruliene and a male who I know to be the Director of Ormskirk Superstore Ltd, Mr Star Khalid Baiz, exiting the rear of the premises with a number of boxes. Ms Geruliene hastily stacked the boxes outside the back door, and Mr Baiz was collecting them and moving them away from the area. He was believed to be putting them inside a vehicle, only part of which was in view of the camera.

The vehicle moved away, and approximately 8 minutes later Ms Geruliene can be seen on the CCTV taking a phone call at the shop counter. She is then seen to remove a black bin bag out of the back door, and place it between the bins at the back of the shop.

Upon viewing this CCTV I went outside via the back door of the shop, and retrieved the black bin bag which I seized. This bag contained the following illicit tobacco products: 10 packs of Richmond cigarettes, 10 packs of Marlboro Gold, 70 packs of Milano capsules, 10 non compliant Elux e-cigarettes. It is believed that the boxes that were removed from the premises also contained illicit tobacco products.

12<sup>th</sup> September 2022 – complaint received from a member of the public who purchased an Elux Legend e-cigarette from Ormskirk Superstore on 15<sup>th</sup> August 2022. She was asked if it was ok for them to remove the packaging before providing it to her, which she agreed to and the staff member put it in a paper bag. The complainant stated that the e-cigarette exploded, and she took it back to the shop to complain a couple of days later. She said that the member of staff called to three men who were outside the shop, who approached the complainant and were very aggressive. They stated they would not give a refund and threatened to drag her out of the shop if she did not leave. She was left feeling shaken and upset by the incident.

**23**<sup>rd</sup> **September 2022** – inspection of premises carried out by Trading Standards and Lancashire Police. Mr Star Khalid Baiz present. 17 packets of illicit Rothmans cigarettes were found concealed inside a hoover in the storeroom, plus 1 packet of Rothmans seized from inside the till.

Approximately 200 non compliant e-cigarettes were seized from under the counter – all of the e-cigarettes on open display were legal and compliant. Given the fact that e-cigarettes had previously been seized from these premises I would suggest that concealing them under the counter was a deliberate action. I noted a large number of empty boxes of these non compliant e-cigarettes in the bin behind the counter, suggesting that staff were removing the boxes of the products before handing them to customers, which I would suggest is being done so that customers are not seen leaving the shop carrying illegal products. Further e-cigarettes were seized from the back room.

Investigations are ongoing.

#### **RELEVANT INFORMATION**

- Supplying (including possessing for supply) tobacco products bearing trademarks without the consent of the proprietor of the mark (counterfeit) is an offence contrary to the Trade Marks Act 1994:
- Supplying (including possessing for supply) tobacco products which are not in plain packaging is an offence, contrary to the Standardised Packaging of Tobacco Products Regulations 2015;
- Supplying (including possessing for supply) tobacco products that do not display compliant health warnings is an offence, contrary to the Tobacco and Related Products Regulations 2016;
- Improperly marked tobacco products deny consumers valuable information about the dangers of smoking. Counterfeit tobacco is normally sold much cheaper than its genuine counterparts typically half the price which undermines price-based strategies to prevent smoking by making it more accessible to adults and children. Cut price tobacco presents unfair competition to legitimate retailers in the area and typically deprives the taxman of £6.17 for cigarettes and £11.30 for hand rolling tobacco, in terms of lost duty and VAT. In the case of counterfeit products there is a further risk in that, unlike their genuine counterparts, there are no controls over what goes into making them or on the levels of harmful substances they might contain. These products have also been found not to comply with requirements to self extinguish if left unattended.

Paragraphs 11.27 & 11.28 of the statutory guidance issued under Section 182 of The Licensing Act 2003 (Home Office April 2018) states that:

'There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises that should be treated particularly seriously. These are the use of the licensed premises ....

...for the sale or storage of smuggled alcohol and tobacco.

It is envisaged that licensing authorities, the police, the Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) and other law enforcement agencies, which are responsible authorities, will use the review procedures effectively to deter such activities and crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of the licence – even in the first instance – should be seriously considered.

During the previous hearing that took place on 28<sup>th</sup> February 2022, Mr Salehi stated that he was not aware of illegal cigarettes being sold from the shop and that he would ensure that incidents that had occurred at the premises were not repeated. The Sub-Committee concluded that there was no evidence to substantiate that Mr Salehi was complicit in the illegal activity.

Since the previous hearing there have been 3 seizures of illegal tobacco from the shop, in addition to seizures of illicit tobacco from Mr Salehi's vehicle and his home address. The evidence now indicates that Mr Salehi is personally heavily involved in the illegal sale and supply of illicit tobacco. He can no longer place the blame on members of staff and claim to be tackling the issues by sacking those staff members.

In the opinion of Lancashire County Council Trading Standards Service the information presented is clear evidence that the licensing objective of the prevention of crime and disorder has been disregarded at these premises.

Lancashire County Council Trading Standards respectfully requests that the Committee considers whether revocation of the premises licence for Ormskirk Superstore would be an appropriate finding in the circumstances.

I believe the contents of this statement to be true.

I entered the store at around 8.10 pm. As I entered, I saw a member of staff moving from behind the counter. The member of staff was male and of middle eastern appearance. He was tall and slim with dark curly hair. He was wearing a white hoodie and looked to be around 30 years of age. I asked him if he had any cheap Richmond cigarettes. He stated that he did and I asked for one packet. He moved back behind the counter and took a packet of cigarettes from under the counter. He said they were £6 and handed them to me. I handed over £20 and received £14 change. I noticed that he did not place the money in the till but into a wallet that was placed in front of the till. Following the sale I left the store. I produce in evidence, x1 packet of Richmond cigarettes, marked as exhibit *CW/1*. The cigarettes were not in standardised packaging and were suspected to be counterfeit. Later that day I handed the cigarettes to a colleague, Lauren Manning.
