## **PUBLIC SPEAKING - PROTOCOL**

(For meetings of <u>Council</u>, Cabinet, Overview & Scrutiny Committees, Audit & Governance Committee and Standards Committee)

# 1.0 Public Speaking

- 1.1 Residents of West Lancashire may, on giving notice, address any of the above meetings to make representations on any item on the agenda for those meetings, except where the public and press are to be excluded from the meeting during consideration of the item.
- 1.2 A Parish Council Representative may, on giving notice, address any of the above meetings to make representations on any item on the agenda for those meetings, except where the public and press are to be excluded from the meeting during consideration of the item.
- 1.32 The form attached as an Appendix to this Protocol should be used for submitting requests.

## 2.0 Deadline for submission

2.1 The prescribed form should be received by Member Services by 10.00 am on the Friday of the week preceding the meeting. This can be submitted by e-mail to <a href="mailto:member.services@westlancs.gov.uk">member.services@westlancs.gov.uk</a> or by sending to:

- 2.2 Completed forms will be collated by Member Services and circulated via e-mail to relevant Members and officers and published on the Council website via Modgov. Only the name of the <a href="mailto:speaker">speaker</a> (and representative)resident and details of the issue to be raised will be published.
- 2.3 Groups of persons with similar views should elect a spokesperson to speak on their behalf to avoid undue repetition of similar points. Spokespersons should identify in writing on whose behalf they are speaking.

## 3.0 Scope

- 3.1 Any matters raised must be relevant to an item on the agenda for the meeting.
- 3.2 The Borough Solicitor may reject a submission if it:
  - (i) is defamatory, frivolous or offensive;
  - (ii) is substantially the same as representations which have already been submitted at a previous meeting; or
  - (iii) discloses or requires the disclosure of confidential or exempt information.

#### 4.0 Number of items

- 4.1 A maximum of one form per resident will be accepted for each Agenda Item.
- 4.2 There will be a maximum of 10 speakers per meeting. Where there are more than 10 forms submitted by residents, the Borough Solicitor will prioritise the list of those allowed to speak. This will be considered having regard to all relevant matters including:
  - a. The order in which forms were received.
  - b. If one resident has asked to speak on a number of items, priority will be given to other residents who also wish to speak
  - c. Whether a request has been submitted in relation to the same issue.

No amendments will be made to the list of speakers once it has been compiled (regardless of withdrawal of a request to speak).

4.3 All submissions <u>received</u> will be <u>published on the Council's website and</u> circulated to Members of the relevant body and officers for <u>considerationinformation</u>, although no amendments will be made to the list of <u>speakers once it has been compiled</u> (regardless of withdrawal of a request to <u>speak</u>).

# 5.0 At the Meeting

- 5.1 Speakers will be shown to their seats. At the commencement of consideration of each agenda item the Leader/Chairman will invite the speakersmembers of the public to make their representations. SpeakersResidents will have up to 3 minutes to address the meeting. The address must reflect the issue included on the prescribed form submitted in advance.
- 5.2 Members may discuss what the speaker/s haves said, along with anyll other information/representations submitted under this protocol, when all public speakers on that item have finished and will then make a decision. Speakers should not circulate any supporting documentation at the meeting and should not enter into a debate with Councillors.
- 5.4 If residents feel nervous or uncomfortable speaking in public, then they can ask someone else to do it for them, including a Parish or Borough Councillor representative. They can also bring an interpreter if they need one. They should be aware there may be others speaking as well.

  (Note: If a Resident wishes to have their Borough Councillor speak on their

behalf, the Borough Councillor is not a member of the body considering the item.)

5.5 Speakers may leave the meeting at any time, taking care not to disturb the meeting.
