We are local residents living within the vacinity of the Ormskirk Market premises and are opposed to certain elements of the application.

## Objectives:

Prevention of Public Nuisance

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

We have been residing in our current address for the last 16 years and based on experience with previous other licenced properties on Moorgate, we have significant concerns over this application.

The prime concern is in relation to the late night refreshment licence. Please note that the proposal is for provision of refreshments both inside and outside. The location of the property is close to many residential properties and our lives will be massively affected by the late night/early morning noise on a proposed regular basis.

When the Arriba and Alpine clubs were operational, we regularly had issue with noise nuisence both from loud music and public disturbances. We had to call the police on a regular basis. If the Ormskirk Market premises are allowed to stay open until Midnight and 2am we know that this noise will go on for an unacceptably late time. Noise at and after closing time will also be a potential public nuisance problem.

Crime and Disorder is also a concern. Increased potential for drug problems and fighting cannot be ignored. Again relating to previous experiences from the previous clubs, Police had to be involved on numerous occasions.

We trust that all issues highlighted will be taken into careful consideration and we eagarly await the outcome.
