# FORMAL RESPONSE FROM COUNTY COUNCILLOR JOHN FILLIS, CABINET MEMBER FOR HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORT, LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL, INCLUDING OFFICER COMMENTS

Recommendations (1) (i) to (vii) at Appendix 1 to the report refers.

- (1) That Lancashire County Council (LCC), as the Highway Authority, give due consideration to the following:
  - (i) the impact of heavy goods traffic in the refurbished area of Ormskirk TownCentre.

### Cabinet Member Response:

"West Lancashire Borough council have been able to provide us with figures regarding the extent of HGV's using the town centre for Lancashire County Council to undertake a review of the current arrangements."

### WLBC Officer Response

We await the outcome of this review.

(ii) the on-going maintenance of the gullies and the monitoring of the effectiveness of the aggregate resin within them.

### Cabinet Member Response:

"Information regarding gully cleaning has been provided to West Lancashire Borough Council and we are quite prepared to discuss the cleaning schedules."

### WLBC Officer Response:

(see note at Appendix 1 (i). However, we would welcome an increased maintenance regime in relation to these particular gullies due to their important town centre location, which also hosts the street market on two days per week.

(iii) the refurbishment of Aughton Street to tie-in with the Moor Street improvements.

### Cabinet Member Response:

"We are happy to discuss further improvements and the funding arrangements to support a scheme."

### WLBC Officer Response:

Aughton Street is an adopted highway and as such all maintenance liabilities rest with LCC.

## (iv) the impact of town centre congestion, including the bottle necks at Derby/Stanley Street/Wigan Road/Moor Street/Moorgate and Park Road.

### Cabinet Member Response:

"A traffic management study will be underway shortly, following this, proposals will be brought forward for consultation before any works are implemented."

### WLBC Officer Response:

We await the results of the traffic management study and any proposals subsequently arising.

(v) the on-going improvements to the rail bridge and cycle link from the TownCentre to Edge Hill University, as contained in the West Lancashire Highways and Transport Masterplan

### Cabinet Member Response:

"Updates will be provided as soon as possible."

### WLBC Officer Response:

We await any updates on this matter.

- (vi) encourage effective enforcement of the Traffic Regulation Orders (TROs) operating in Ormskirk Town Centre, particularly on Market Days by exploring:
  - (a) the provision of more clearer signage to alert drivers to the restrictions of the TROs;
  - (b) breaches of on-street parking.

#### <u>Cabinet Member Response:</u>

"Discussion should currently be taking place at officer level."

### WLBC Officer Response:

We are awaiting a response from County Council officers in relation to suggestions made to potential improvements to the current LCC on-street enforcement arrangements in Ormskirk town centre.

(vii) in relation to finding a permanent solution to traffic management safety in the pedestrian area of Ormskirk by exploring:

### Cabinet Member Response:

"We would be happy to discuss what funding arrangements West Lancashire Borough Council are proposing for these changes."

#### WLBC Officer Response:

As yet no changes to the exiting Ormskirk town centre traffic management arrangements have been agreed with the County Council, as highway network managers.
