Domestic Homicide

A 'Domestic Homicide Review' refers to a review of the circumstances in which the death of a person aged 16 or over has or appears to have resulted from violence, abuse or neglect by: -

•a person whom he/she was related or had been in an intimate personal relationship, or

•a member of the same household





Jailed for life: Killer who brutally stabbed girlfriend to death with pair of scissors

Dad fatally stabs girlfriend in neck with scissors over row about pet lobster

Thug who subjected his girlfriend to a long-running campaign of violence stabbed her to death with a pair of scissors after a petty row over their pet lobster is jailed for life





The purpose of a DHR is to

- Establish what lessons are to be learned from the domestic homicide regarding the way in which local professionals and organisations work individually and together to safeguard victims;
- ➤ Identify clearly what those lessons are both within and between agencies, how and within what timescales they will be acted on, and what is expected to change as a result;
- Apply these lessons to service responses including changes to policies and procedures as appropriate;
- Prevent domestic violence, abuse and homicides and improve service responses for all domestic violence and abuse victims and their children through improved intra and inter-agency working.

CSE & Healthy Relationships

- In 2016 a CSE awareness and prevention programme was commissioned by WLCSP and delivered to year all year 7 students in West Lancashire by Freedom Personal Safety, in partnership with the police.
- To ensure sustainability, in 2016 /17 WLCSP commissioned FPS to deliver the programme to teachers and safeguarding leads, who will then deliver the programme to pupils.
- 27 teachers and safeguarding leads across 9 schools. (3 staff from 9 West Lancashire schools) received the training in November 2017
- Burscough High School, Our Lady Queen of Peace, Ormskirk High School, West Lancashire High School, Acorns, Lathom High School, Hope High School, St Bedes School and Tarleton High School.





- A follow up survey showed that teachers and safeguarding leads have significantly increased their confidence in teaching sessions to pupils.
- Against the survey question ' I feel confident in teaching sessions on Grooming and CSE - the following responses were recorded: -
 - Extremely confident increased from a baseline of 0% to 24%
 - Very Confident increased from a baseline of 6% to 65%
 - And Not Confident at All decreased from a baseline of 61% to zero
- The evaluation stats for teaching sessions on Healthy Relationships also mirror these figures.
- The evaluation feedback, demonstrates that we should not assume that safeguarding leads in schools have a current good understanding of this subject.
- The initial evaluation data clearly evidences the value of delivering this project.





Next Steps

- The teaching staff that received the training are now rolling out sessions to students and colleagues.
- We will be contacting the teachers for a progress report on delivery of their action plans in March and further evaluation will be produced by FPS.
- Findings will be written up and included in a final report which will be presented to WLCSP.
- The work undertaken by FPS in West Lancashire will be showcased at a National CSE Conference in March 2017
- WLCSP have also nominated FPS for an Unsung Hero Award and hopefully we will receive some national recognition for the excellent work commissioned by WLCSP on this theme.
